Rom 15:4 GOOD HOPE THROUGH SCRIPTURE

PRELIMS. Well in a world like our's we are all in need of having **good hope** that is truly good hope. Who can live without hope? Everyone has a hope of some kind - even if it is **false hope**. It is a very **solemn fact** that even false hope can 'keep us going'! People look forward to all kind of things which give the **joy/excitement!** Xmas; Birthdays; Holidays; World Cup; Wimbledon!!!!! These things **do** keep some people going and 'getting through life'! They have **nothing else** to look forward to, nothing beyond this life!

The Bible here tells us [4] the Scriptures were written that "we might have hope"! God desires our happiness! He wants us to have real hope, look: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope" Isn't that wonderful! God wants us to abound in joy!

WHAT is HOPE?

Hope in the Bible is not what we know as hope today. There **no uncertainty** in the Biblical hope. We use hope after sitting an **exam** 'I hope I have passed'! Or after an **interview** 'I hope I have got the job'! That is **not** Biblical hope! Biblical hope is **full** of **certainty!** It is something **positive** and **definite**. It is what John called "the **confidence** that we have toward Him" [1John 5:14]

Hope is something to be **enjoyed** - without **doubting!** Doubt **spoils** everything! I know Xns who can't enjoy their salvation in X because of **doubt!** I do not find believers doubting in the Bible! "*Doubtless You are our Father*" [Isa 63:16 AV] "We believe and are sure You are the Son of the living God" [John 6:69 AV] God gave us the Scriptures so that we would be sure and not doubt! Con of Faith: 'this certainty is not a mere conjecture and probable persuasion, grounded upon a fallible hope; but an **infallible assurance**' [4:18-20]

To have hope is to be **strengthened** in faith. **Opposite** of **weakness!** It was hope that helped Abraham who "*In hope....believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations...He did not weaken in faith ...but he grew strong in his faith" [4:18-20] When*

God wanted to show His character, His unchangeable character, He swears an oath "so that...we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us" [H6:18]

To be **confused** about **God's will** for you is one thing; to be confused about your **salvation** is another! Some people are so mixed up about faith, election, predestination, that they waver like a leaf - but **this hope** is "a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf" [Heb 6:19] An anchor is a symbol of **security!** Faith must be fixed on a sound anchor, else it is **useless!**

Sure refers to its **natural essence** of solidarity within itself - it **won't crumble** under pressure. Steadfast refers to its **unwavering** firmness - it won't move from its position! Some things can be good - but **mutable** - it can change from being good to not so good...mutability is a weakness, it is not a good thing.Only God is **immutable!**

What is it to 'have' this hope? It is simple to have Christ! Paul wrote of: "Christ Jesus our hope" [1T1:1] and "Christ in you, the hope of glory" [Col 1:27] When millionaires are after success, it is not the money they are after but the glory! The glory of sportsmen winning at Golf, Tennis, Football...or the glory of political power, or the glory attached to business success, is not to be considered in the same league as having the glory of Christ! The glory of sportsmen, etc, passes away! It has such a limited short duration. I remember the excitement in school, in the neighbourhood of Laurie Reilly scoring the last minute winner against England in 1952!! We boys talked about it for months on end - but it is now all gone! They have their reward, or as it is now, they have HAD their reward!

But the glory of Christ **never ends** but **increases** as time goes on! There are more people enjoying the victories of the prophets and saints in the NT now than ever before - there are more people honouring them than ever before! The more saints they meet in heaven will honour them!

In [Eph 2:12] we read about those who have **no hope!** They are said

to be "separated from Christ...having no hope and without God in the world"! So conversely, having hope is being in Christ! You have no real hope, if you are out of Christ!

FINDING THIS GREAT HOPE - FINDING CHRIST

All some people want in life is to win £1M in the lottery. I am told the chance are million to one! Yet people keep trying! Despite there being so much uncertainty in winning the lottery. There is no guarantee! APP But with the gospel there is a guarantee! "seek and you will find" - thats better than 'Buy a ticket and you will very likely not win!" "You will find Me when you seek for Me with all your heart" [twice Deu 4:9 + Jer 29:13] "I did not say to the offspring of Jacob 'Seek Me in vain'" [Isa 45:19]

Our text tells us about the **Scriptures**. That is where you can find hope! What a wonderful book is the Bible! **No book** has **survived** such **examination/scrutiny/opposition!** People have tried for **centuries** to prove it is a **myth** - without success! People are **still finding Christ** in the Bible! The Bible has **changed** so many lives!

But there is a warning! Some people have great confidence in the Scriptures. They read it daily and would never stop - some would even die for it! The Scriptures are vital to our faith. without it we would be in ignorance - like heathen! God has revealed Himself in the Scriptures. Without it we would not know the gospel. Paul says "my gospel...has now become disclosed and through the prophetic writings has been made known to all nations" [Rom 16:26] But there can a great difference between knowing the Scriptures and knowing Jesus Christ! You can know the Scriptures really well - and yet not know Jesus Christ at all! We must distinguish between knowing Christ and knowing the Bible!

The **Book** itself won't safe anyone. It is not the **Book** itself, it is not the printed page that saves us, it is the **Christ** that is **portrayed** and **revealed** in Scripture that saves us! The Bible **points** us to Someone and that Someone is Jesus Christ! The **Saviour of the world** is revealed in the Scriptures! The Book talks and speaks of Someone

beautiful and lovely - and unless we know that Someone, we will be lost no matter how well we knew the Bible! We are **not saved** by knowing a **Book** - we are saved by knowing the **Person** of Jesus X!

When Jesus was leaving His disciples for the last time, He did **not** say to them 'Don't worry that I am going away, I am going to send you a Book'! No. He said 'Don't worry, "I will pray the Father and He will send you Another Comforter/Helper to be with you forever...even the Spirit of truth...You know Him for He dwells with you and shall be in you"! [John 14:17] Some Xns have been accused of swapping a Person for a Book, ie, the Saviour for the Bible.

Now a **Person** is a **living** thing - a Book is **inanimate**! You must find that Person, that Christ that is revealed in the Book. When you find Him, you find real hope - that is why Peter says "a **living** hope through the **resurrection** of Jesus Christ" [1Pet 1:3]

So if you do not have Christ and you want Him - then look at this Book, pray as you read, and ask God to **reveal** to your **soul** the **Person** it talks about! If **you** keep doing that, you will find Christ!

The Apostles were great believers and glorified God more than any other group of people. Yet they **never had the Bible**. They did not carry a NT or an iPod in their pockets with the text of Scripture!! But they all had **Christ**! The Apostle had **no bible studies** - they just studied **Jesus** that looked on and remembered!!

That is why the Scriptures say "looking unto Jesus...consider Him" Heb 12:2,3] It is **not written** 'whatever things were written were written that you might have a good knowledge of theology and truth' but rather "whatever was written...was written...that...you might have hope/Christ" [4]! "For I tell you that this Scripture must be fulfilled in Me: 'And He was numbered with the transgressors.' For what is written about Me has its fulfillment" [Luke 22:37]!

After the Emmaus Road experience that Jesus "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures...that the Christ should suffer and...rise from the dead" It is Christ rising from the dead that saves us. Do you agree? Then thank God for the Scriptures!
