Genesis 2: Man and Woman

In Genesis 2, we see the first usage of "LORD God." (YHWH elohim). (2:4)

In Genesis 2, we also see the first of ten usages of "generations" (toledoth). (2:4)

In Genesis 2, God gives man the covenant of works. (2:16-17; WCF 7:2)

In Genesis 2, God institutes work (2:15) and marriage (2:24).

God created man in His image male and female. (Gen 1:27)

What is the "mystery" portrayed in the relationship of the husband and wife? (Eph 5:25-33)

Paul draws the parallel between the "first man" Adam and the "last man" Christ. (1 Cor 15:45)

The first man dwells with his wife in the Garden. (Gen 2:8)

The *last man* dwells with his **bride** in the **New Jerusalem**. (Rev 21:3)

What are some additional parallels between the original creation and new creation? (Rev 21:1-22:5)

Before the new creation is ushered in, the old creation will pass away with a **Big Bang**. (2 Pet 3:10-13)

How long does it take to create a new heaven and new earth once the old has passed away? (Rev 21:1)

Four things notably missing from the new creation are <u>death</u>, <u>mourning</u>, <u>crying</u>, and <u>pain</u>. (Rev 21:4)

Adam served as the <u>federal head</u> of his future descendants. Christ now serves as the <u>head</u> of His <u>church</u>. (1 Cor 15:21-22; Eph 1:22-23)

When the man and the woman were created, they were <u>naked</u> and not <u>ashamed</u>. There was no shame because there was no <u>guilt</u>. (Gen 2:25)

Several important historical references in Genesis 2:

- Characters: God, the man, and his wife
- Places: Eden, Havilah, Cush, Assyria
- Things: rivers, plants, animals, jewels, gold
- Events: God formed the man; God planted a garden; God put the man in the garden; God commanded the man; man named the animals; God made woman from man and brought her to the man
