Jeremiah: Outline¹ and Walkthrough

God will Watch Over His Word to Judge Jerusalem via Babylon, But Restoration is Promised

The prophet, ch 1a-d

Set over kingdoms to break down and build. Judah will fight against you but not prevail.

The 2 themes:

- ♦ Almond rod = God "watching" ("almond") (here, 31:28, 44:27) over His word to do it, ch 1b
- ◆ The boiling pot, BP, from the north = Northern, Babylonian conglomerate) vs. Jerusalem, ch 1c

Almond 1: Prosecutorial case vs. bride, Jerusalem (and all Israel), ch 2

But the Prosecutor was husband, still with desire! ch 3 [v 18 previews Center, chs 30-33] But the Prosecutor is just, ch 4a, BP, v 6 • The Prophet feels and sees it, ch 4b (v 19)

The Prosecutor's case continues, ch 5, BP

The Prosecutor sentences to war, warning, and deafness, 6, BP, v 1, 22

The Prosecutor specifies crimes, 7-10 (Adultery-7, Idolatry-8-10), BP, 10:22

The Husband feels it, 8-9

• The Prophet feels and sees it, 8b, 9

The Prosecutor reads the Law, 11

The Prosecutor includes the Prophet (persecution), 11b

• THE TARGETED PROPHET JOINS THE PROSECUTION, 12

Prosecutor: Exhibit 1: Sash on the Prophet stashed & trashed-Israel spoiled to Him, 13a Ironic full wine jars (stupor & destruction, not blessing), 13b

The shames of the Prosecutor's wife, 13c

Court convenes on site: Famine, 14a Wife's witnesses (False Prophets) unmasked, 14b Confession taught, 14c

Prosecutor's inflexibility & sentencing guidelines, 15a • The Prophet feels and sees it, 15b

The Prosecutor includes the Prophet (no wife/family), 16, continues His case, BP, v 15

(Restoration hint, v 15, as 3:18)

The case per man's rotten soul, 17a

• THE PROPHET JOINS THE PROSECUTION, 17b

The Prosecutor reads the Sabbath, 17c, including its blessings for obedience

<u>Court convenes on site</u>: + **Ex**hibit 2: Potter & clay: God redresses nations, 18a

Exhibit 3: Clay Jar, broken at idolatrous Tophet, where Israel would be buried, 19

False Frephet/ defense attorney punishes the Prophet, who pronounces his captivity, 20a

BP, v 5-6

• The Prophet Both Complains AND Joins THE Prosecution, 20b

Almond 2: **K**ing Zedekiah inquires. Jerusalem to be overthrown, 21a. Mitigation offered, 21b, **BP**- The same dooms & mitigations had been offered to the 3 previous kings, 22

Prosecutor denounces \mathcal{F}_{alse} $\mathcal{P}_{rephets}$ and contrasts them to true prophets, 23, **BP**, v 8

Good and rotten figs. Good = preserved post-Captivity; bad = everyone else, including those left in the land, 24

Prosecutor's sentence of 70 years, BP, v 9, then Babylon judged, 25a

Prosecutor vs. other nations, 25b (Preview of ch 46-52)

Prosecutor sends the Prophet to warn of judgment to provoke repentance. Ahikam saves him from the Priest & False Prophet faction's death threat, 26

Exhibit 4: Restraints & harnesses on the Prophet's neck, returned with foreign envoys:

All serve Neb or else. Surrender and live, 27a. Temple vessels won't return; more will go, 27b

Hanani, False Prophet, breaks wood harness. God: "Iron harness now. Hanani dies this year," 28

Letter to early captives: "Long stay. God's peace." To Shemaiah, False Prophet: "Not to you," 29

Almond 3 (31:28, "watch"): Israel & Judah promised to return when judgment complete, 30

God will richly restore them from captivity and be their God. New Covenant promised, 31²

The prophet jailed, from where he buys/redeems land. Exhibit 5: Deed into storage, 32a

Prayer questioning BP. God confirms judgment & restoration, 32b. God alleviates

Jeremiah's doubt over destruction, 33a.

God assures David's throne + Levites until Messiah King, 33b

Almond 4: Prosecutor: King Zedekiah will die in Babylon. Freed slaves had been re-enslaved, 34

The Rechabites obeyed their father (no wine, houses, or gardens); Israel disobeyed God, 35

King Jehoiakim cuts & burns Jeremiah's scroll of judgments that had made many leaders think. Jehoiakim's line to end. BP, v 29, ch 36

King Zedekiah inquires. Same message, BP. Zedekiah moves Jeremiah to less dangerous jail, 37

² 31:40, the permanent *attachment* of judgment to redemption.

The prophet thrown into miry prison. Ethiopian Ebed Melech saves him, 38a Zedekiah inquires: City burned if he'll surrender! Zedekiah's cover story for the session, 38b

BP fulfilled! Jerusalem falls. Jeremiah favored. Good forecast for Ebed Melech, 39

Almond 5: Jeremiah with Gedaliah, governor of the remaining poor. Hidden Jews return, 40
Ishmael kills Gedaliah and others. Johanan rescues hostages. They prepare to *go to Egypt*, 41
They ask Jeremiah what God wants them to do. **The Prosecutor** tells him their deceit, 42
They revoke Jeremiah's counsel to *stay in the land*, 43a

Exhibit 6: Large stones placed in a royal Egyptian pavement = Neb will be king here, BP, 43b

The Prophet to all the Jews throughout Egypt: Judgment for continued idolatries follows you, 44a They justify worship to Queen of Heaven, 44b. God "watches over" them for evil, v 27

God corrects/ comforts Baruch's complaints. His life is a large enough prize, 45

Almond 6: God's word to other nations, 46-51, **BP**, and recap to Jerusalem, 52

Egypt, Moab, Moab, Ammon, and Elam to experience some degree of restoration.

Old *Egypt*: Yahweh's vengeance on her gods & kings through Neb, but repeopled, 46a but Israel will return from exile, 46b

The BP will bald Philistia, 47

Moab will be ashamed of god Chemosh and destroyed, but prisoners restored "end of days," 48 Post war, Israel will inherit *Ammon*, then Ammonite prisoners restored, 49a

Edom/ Esau will be stripped, 49b Damascus to be overcome, 49c

Neb to strike Kedar and Hazor. They're left empty, 49d

Elam to be destroyed & scattered. Yahweh's throne there. Latter days, captivity returned, 49e

Babylon's fall and Israel's restoration- alternating themes throughout 50-51
Babylon captured, gods Bel and Merodach undone, by nations to her north (none at that time).
Israel to be restored (50:4-8; 17-20; 33-34). Complete success of Babylon's enemies, 50
Babylon's enemies encouraged. Israel/ Judah not forsaken 51:5, God's hammer, v 20-23.
Nothing left of Babylon, 51

Exhibit 7: Seraiah to read this in Babylon, bind it, and throw it into the Euphrates, as Babylon will sink to rise no more, 51:59-64

Almond 7: Recap- Judah torn down + hint of its rebuilding (ch 1 fulfilled). Inventory of Temple furnishings taken. Those killed vs. those taken. Jehoiachin's eventual promotion in prison, 52
