IV. Warnings and Counsels

- A. Can I love my country too much?
 - If I feel I have more in common with someone because we are Americans rather than because we are Christians (esp from different countries who are in Christ).
 - If my concerns for my own country eclipse any concern for the nations in terms of missions or the persecuted church.
 - If political issues consume me and squeeze out the means of grace and a walk with God, do not presume that one's patriotism or nationalism is spirituality.
