So they went both of them together. 9 When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built the altar there and laid the wood in order and bound

Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. 10 Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to slaughter his son. 11 But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 12 He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him, for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me."

The Testing, 22.1b

- · Testing is for our good
 - What have we learned
 - What will Abraham's heart hold back
- God calls, Abraham listens
 - Personal friendship

The Command, 22.2

- No verbal response from Abraham given
- Stunning command from God is clear
- Abraham obeys
 - Command defies common sense
 - o Command emphasizes Abraham's affection for Isaac
- What is our treasure?

The Response, 22.3-12

- Gets up early
- Careful details
- We will worship- and come back
- How does Abraham say this?
 - o Resurrection, Hebrews 11.17-19
- God intervenes, 22.11-12
 - o Abraham demonstrates obedience, faith, and love
 - His heart holds nothing back...
