I was born in 1959 & grew up in Atlanta, GA. I was raised in a Christian home and came to faith at age 14. I moved to NH in 1985 to get married. I have been married to Wendy since 1986. We have two adult children: Sam, who lives in Chattanooga, and Emma, who is married & lives near us.

I have two other connections to the church! In the mid 1990's, Wendy's sister took a job at Dartmouth Hospital and she attended the church. Haggai 1:1-15

9:30 Morning Worship Service:

Working on a Building

- 1. Vs. 1-11: Are you one of "these people"?
- 2. Vs. 12-15: Will you-
 - ➤ Obey the LORD'S Call?
 - ➤ Show God the proper and holy fear He deserves
 - ➤ Repent of your Sin?
 - ➤ Will you allow the Spirit to stir your soul?
 - Act in Faith as He has called you? God has called us to Himself saying "I am with you"
- 3. God has called us to Himself saying "I am with you"

Application: How do we go from "these people" to "I am with you"?

- 1. Are you filled with the Spirit, resting only in Christ?
- 2. Is building God's Kingdom your highest priority?

Conclusion: As we live our lives, *do the words of Jesus ring in our ears daily*? "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:33) And as we 'seek Him', what do we expect in return? Are we seeking to bargain with God for material blessing in return for obedience? Or are we content to see God glorified, His kingdom built, and His righteousness poured out upon us?

Hebrews 11:8-10

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God.

Isaiah 8:11-15

For the LORD spoke thus to me with his strong hand upon me, and warned me not to walk *in the way of this people*, saying: "Do not call conspiracy all that this people calls conspiracy, and do not fear what they fear, nor be in dread. *But the LORD of hosts, him you shall honor as holy*. Let him be your fear, and let him be your dread. And he will become a sanctuary and a stone of offense and a rock of stumbling to both houses of Israel, a trap and a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem. And many shall stumble on it. They shall fall and be broken; they shall be snared and taken."

Acts 9:31

So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied.

Luke 17:1-4

And he said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and *if he repents, forgive him*, and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."

Exodus 35:20-22

Then all the congregation of the people of Israel departed from the presence of Moses. And they came, *everyone whose heart stirred him*, and everyone whose spirit moved him, and brought the LORD's contribution to be used for the tent of meeting, and for all its service, and for the holy garments. So they came, both men and women. *All who were of a willing heart* brought brooches and earrings and signet rings and armlets, all sorts of gold objects, every man dedicating an offering of gold to the LORD.

First Corinthians 1:9-10

God is faithful, by whom *you were called into the fellowship of his Son*, Jesus Christ our Lord. I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that *you be united in the same mind and the same judgment*.

First Corinthians 16:13-14

Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

The Jews who had returned to Jerusalem from captivity in Babylon had stopped working on constructing the temple of God. The Lord sent the prophet Haggai to call His people to consider their sin. How do we often fall into the same temptation?

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Haggai 1:1-15; Hebrews 11:8-10; Isaiah 8:11-15; Acts 9:31; Luke 17:1-4; Exodus 35:20-22; First Corinthians 1:9-10; 16:13-14; Psalm 89:5-8. DISCUSS How are you (we) obeying God by faith? What do you need to turn from today? MEDITATE on Matthew 6:33. PRAY "Lord of hosts, *forgive us*! We as Your people so often take You for granted and neglect to obey You as we should."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ **Haggai 1:1-15**; **Hebrews 11:8-10**; **Acts 9:31**. DISCUSS What about faith leads to obedience? Why did Abraham go out? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Matthew 6:33**. PRAY, "Lord of hosts, You give us every reason to obey You. Enliven us to believe You fully as so live out action by faith."

Tuesday

READ **Haggai 1:1-15**; **Isaiah 8:11-15**; **Psalm 89:5-8**. DISCUSS How are the "people" in Haggai and Isaiah the same here? Are you "one of these people"? Are you walking in their way? How is the gospel the only way we can both fear God and know Him as our "sanctuary" and safety? What does it mean to honor God as holy? MEDITATE on **Matthew 6:33**. PRAY, "Lord our God, You have shown us that You are faithful! Protect us from stumbling and keep our eyes on You."

Wednesday

READ Haggai 1:1-15; Luke 17:1-4; Exodus 35:20-22; Acts 9:31. DISCUSS What does it mean for the Holy Spirit to stir your soul? Why is the result generosity with others? In both Luke and Exodus we see God's people generously forgiving and sharing as a result. How is *that* manifest in your life? MEDITATE Matthew 6:33. PRAY, "Lord our God, You have given us the Holy Spirit to lead us. Keep us from resisting Him and *help us to delight in His leading.*"

Thursday

READ **Haggai 1:1-15**; **First Corinthians 1:9-10**; **16:13-14**; **Psalm 89:5-8**. DISCUSS How has God called us to live by faith? What should that look like in our community at FCCW? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Matthew 6:33**. PRAY, "Lord of hosts, You have already united us together in Christ. Please help us to live out that unity by faith."

Friday

READ Haggai 1:1-15; Hebrews 11:8-10; Isaiah 8:11-15; Acts 9:31; Luke 17:1-4; Exodus 35:20-22; First Corinthians 1:9-10; 16:13-14; Psalm 89:5-8. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on Matthew 6:33. SERVE by putting someone else's interests above your own! PRAY that we at FCCW would trust Christ together.

Saturday

PREPARE today for gathered Sunday worship tomorrow. CONSIDER What can you do today to be better prepared for gathering with God's people tomorrow? READ **Haggai 2:1-23**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for worship services at 9:30 am. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, prepare Your people to hear Your Word. Gather us together to delight in You."
