- 1. What most surprised, puzzled or impressed you from this sermon?
- 2. What was most helpful? Why? How will you apply it in your daily life?
- 3. What Scripture references were most helpful and why?
- 4. What are the primary *doctrinal* points of the sermon? Do you *believe* these things?
- 5. What are the primary *practical* points? Do you *do* these things?
- 6. Read Chapter 20: Of Christian Liberty and Liberty of Conscience of The Westminster Confession of Faith.
  - a. What is Christian liberty?
  - b. What is Liberty of Conscience?
  - c. What are the similarities and differences between them?
  - d. In the Ten Commandments, where is the foundation of liberty found?
  - e. How are the distinctions between Christian liberty and liberty of conscience reflected in the Ten Commandments? (Ex.20:1f) In the Great Commandment? (Mt.22:37-39).
  - f. How are these same things evident in Colossians? (see Col.1:13; 2:20f; 3:5f)
- 7. What is the right use of Christian liberty? (Gal.5:13f) What is necessary for this? Where does this necessity come from?
- 8. What is the right use of the liberty of conscience?
- 9. What is the necessary connection between the true nature of these liberties and their right use?
- 10. How was liberty abused in Corinth? What use does Paul constantly urge? How? (chp.13; see Gal.5:13) Where this come from? (chp.12; see Gal.5:14f) How does Paul set forth his example?
