Jesus' point: Since all belongs to God, nothing by which you swear is exempt from invoking His Name!

Biblical Examples of Oaths—NT:

Jesus – Mat. 26:63 Paul – Gal. 1:20; II Cor. 1:23 Angel – Rev. 10:5-7

Reformers' view of oaths:

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Oaths to commit sin were not valid

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Unbiblical oaths weren't binding

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WCF: Only oaths regarding "weighty" matters were allowed

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e.g. marriage, making covenants, affirming our witness in court, etc.

Vs. 13 – Appropriate verbal response

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Note the cases involve the two occasions when sinful oaths occur

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See Prov. 30:7-9

Vs. 13 – Appropriate verbal response

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When "merry", sing, don't boast!

Note: In both cases, our words are directed to God, not man or things!
