 - A. The Nature of the Trinity: Equal in essence, Distinct in Persons and Roles
 - 1. Two Pillars of Trinitarian Doctrine: Equality and Distinction e.g., John 1:1
 - 2. Equal in Essence an equality even greater than what exists between two human beings
 - 3. Distinct Persons a distinction in role and relationship (*not* essence), and one that includes an eternal relationship of authority and submission
 - B. Genesis 1:26-28 "... Let us make man in our image ... male and female he created them"
 - 1. Equal in Essence
 - 2. Distinct in Role/Function (see pp. 5-7 of "Egalitarian & Complementarian Positions")
 - C. Confirmed by 1 Cor 11:3 "... Christ is the head of every man, and man is the head of a woman, and God is the head of Christ."

III. The Pattern of Created Marriage from Christ and the Church

- A. Genesis 2:18-25 "... This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman' for she was taken from 'man' ... and the two shall become one flesh."
- B. Ephesians 5:22-33 "... This mystery is great; but I am speaking with reference to Christ and the Church ..."
 - 1. Wives: Submit to (or respect, v. 33) your husbands as the Church submits to Christ
 - 2. Husbands: Love your wives as Christ loves the Church
