I. THE IMPORTANCE OF HONORING THE NAME OF THE LORD

A. God is jealous about His Name: Ex. 34:12-17; Deut. 4:23-28; 6:14-15

- 1. Jealousy can be sinful but also good (2 Cor. 11:2-3)
- 2. Jealousy reveals someone's deep love commitment a. God reveals a commitment to His own glory: Is. 48:11
- B. Are you jealous of the glory of God as seen in Rev. 4:10-11?

II. THE COMMAND NOT TO USE GOD'S NAME IN VAIN

- A. The meaning of the Hebrew 'vain'
 - 1. God commands we express His Name or reflect His Character
 - 2. Consider: Lev. 18:21; 21:6; Ezek. 36:20; Amos 2:7; Rom 2:21-23
- B. Examples of using God's name by living dishonorable
 1. when we use His Name trivially dishonorably: Is. 6:1
 - 2. when we use His Name as a curse swear word (Lev. 5:1)
 - 3. when we make *false oath / break oath / lie under oath Lev. 19:12* a. God doesn't forbid the use of oaths:
 - He made them: Ps. 110:4; Ezek. 33:10
 - His people vowed: Gen. 21:24; Josh 9:15, 19; Rom. 1:9

4. when we blaspheme God's Being – Spirit: Lev. 24:11; Matt. 21:31

5. when we live in an unholy manner: Ezek. 36:20; Matt. 5:13-17
