Introduction

- What would you do differently if you knew you had only a limited amount of time to live?
- Reality Check: All of us have a limited time to live!
- Peter's awareness of his impending death—John 21:18-19
- Peter's belief in Christ's imminent return—John 14:1-3; Acts 1:11; Matt 24:42-44

## Alert to Pray!

#### A. Time Frame: "The end of all things is at hand"

- 1. Refers to the imminent return of Jesus Christ.
  - a. Early church believed they were living in the "last days". 1 John 2:18; 2 Timothy 4:3-4
  - b. Next prophetic event: rapture of the church. 1 Thess. 4:15-17 Revelation 22:20
  - 2. We are still waiting for the return of Jesus Christ

### B. Practical Application of Prophecy: "Therefore"

- 1. General Statements: Prophecy's main purpose is to motivate us for godly living
- 2. **Biblical Examples:** 1 John 3:1-3; Romans 13:11-13; 1 Corinthians 15:51-53; 2 Peter 3:10-12a; James 5:7-8
- 3. **Five practical applications** from 1 Peter 4 (first two)
  - a. Keep our heads screwed on straight, and not be carried away by self-indulgence or excitement. 1 Peter 4:7
    - 1) "serious"—"to be in one's right mind" Mark 5:15
    - 2) Characteristics of one who is "serious"—Romans 12:3; Col. 3:2, 16; 2 Cor. 10:5; 1 Pet. 1:13
    - 3) Not sidetracked by controversies and conspiracy theories.

#### b. Must be mentally alert for effective prayer. 1 Peter 4:7

- 1) Peter's failure in Gethsemane—Matt. 26:40-41
- 2) "Watch and pray" living in the last days—Luke 21:34-36
- 3) Prayer as our offensive weapon in spiritual warfare. Ephesians 6:18-20; 1 Peter 5:7-8
- 4) Satan's schemes and prayer
  - a) Keeps us from praying by sowing doubt and encouraging complacency. 1 John 5:14-15
  - b) Distracts us, and thus discourage us.
- 5) Three practical suggestions
  - a) Know best time for alertness in prayer.
  - b) Try different postures in prayer
  - c) Keep a prayer list
