INTRO, I SAMUEL

Originally I and II Samuel were one book. "Samuel", "asked of God." Other versions refer to 4 books of kings (I S/II S/IK/IIK). Actually, it breaks up the story of David artificially to divide Samuel. (We will continue on to II Samuel 5 where he is anointed king of all Israel). I Samuel is the story of Samuel, Saul, David. II Samuel finishes the story of David. The author: I Chronicles 29:29 lists 3 possibilities. I Sam 25:1 shows that Samuel did not write it all. Nor is all of "Samuel" concerning the man Samuel. But recall it was originally one book, and the tradition seems to be to give a book a name based on where it begins. (Exodus, Numbers, e.g.)

As to the time of I Samuel: Birth of Samuel is c.1105. Death of Saul, c. 1011 BC. Hence, 94 years. Time of II Samuel: Reign of David in Hebron, 1011-1004 BC. In Jerusalem, 1004-971 BC. A Total of 40 years. Setting: The land of **Canaan** during the end days of the judges, and first days of the kings, of **Israel**, whose name will now replace the son of Ham. Divisions: **I Samuel** has 3 parts: 1) Samuel (1-7) 2) Saul (8-15) and 3) Saul and David (16-31). **II Samuel** also has 3 parts, all concerning King David: 1) His triumphs (1-10) 2) His transgression (11) and 3) His troubles (12-24)

Christ of Samuel: Rich typology. **Samuel** is prophet, priest, and ruler (judge). Brings in new age. **David** is born in Bethlehem, is a shepherd, is King of Israel. Anointed king, forerunner of the Messianic King. His Psalms breathe the very words of the Messiah (22, e.g.) Jesus is the "seed of

David." and "the Root and the Offspring of David." David wants to build a house for God. God wants to build David's house into the Messiah's. Promised eternal kingdom, throne, and seed, as was Jesus (Luke 1:32-33).
