B. Providence (Romans :1-7)

Let every soul subordinate itself [hupotasso] to superior authorities, for there is not authority except established by God, and those which are stand appointed [tasso] by God. Wherefore, the one who opposes [antitassomai] the authority has resisted the institution [diatage] of God, and those who have resisted will receive judgment against themselves. For the rulers are not a cause of fear for the good work, but rather for the bad. And do you wish not to fear the authority? Do what is good, and you will have praise from it. For it is a servant of God for you resulting in good. But if you do what is bad, do fear! For it does not carry the sword arbitrarily! For it is a servant of God, an avenger resulting in wrath against the one practicing what is bad. Therefore it is a necessity to subordinate oneself [hupotasso], not only on account of wrath, but rather also on account of conscience. For on account of this also do you pay taxes: for they are public servants of God, persisting for this very purpose. Render your debts to everyone, tax to whom tax is owed, custom to whom custom is owed, fear to whom fear is owed, honor to whom honor is owed. [DJP]
