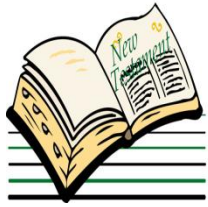

11. How far-ranging will the new exodus be (vv. 15-16)?
12. How is the good news that God will save the world and reconstitute a world-wide people for Himself obscured or missed by people today?
13. How is Jesus often misidentified?
14. Why do you think God uses the figures of a "stump" and a "branch" to picture His Messiah?
15. What does it mean to be poor and oppressed?
16. Why should Christians care about justice for the poor and oppressed?
