	The Resistant Response
• T	ne path naturally would be a harder place.
• T	nere are people who hear the gospel, & it goes in one ear & out the other.
• Ti	nere are two ways people resist the gospel.
	• Resisting – These people are hard to the gospel & they know it.
	They hear the words & make arguments against the truth. Most of these people
*	are very intelligent. Their minds have no trouble understanding; but their heart,
	like the path the sower used, is hard. Saul of Tarsus is a good example.
	<ul> <li>Resisting – This is the majority of people who hear the gospel &amp;</li> </ul>
	don't respond. They just don't get it. It seems strange to them. They hear the
	gospel, maybe even many times, but that light-bulb just never goes off.
	The Shallow Response
• Je	sus describes it as seed which falls into a rocky area. This might be an area not far
fr	om the path that has a thin layer of top-soil.
	the seed has an opportunity to lodge into the soil, but not enough soil to grow a root.
W	ith no root to retrieve from the soil, the hot sun withers the plant.
	ne sun represents tribulation or persecution.
• Cl	ues that a false believer has shallow faith.

	<ul> <li>Unwillingness to endure pain / tribulation.</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>Tribulation means "to or"</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>When squeezed on Christ's account, these false Christians do not endure.</li> <li>Consider the Apostles. All 12 faced tribulation because of their faith in the word (11 murdered, 1 boiled in oil &amp; exiled to a convicts' island).</li> <li>In February 2015, ISIS beheaded Egyptian Coptic Christians on a beach in Libya. The video shows them praying one last time before they all cry out in unison, "O my Lord Jesus" before their heads were severed.</li> <li>The Distracted Response</li> <li>The thorns are the cares of this world &amp; the deceitfulness of riches. Luke adds the pleasures of this life.</li> </ul>
•	Many people who profess Christ actually worship other gods – &
•	What do you get when you preach a false gospel?  The Genuine Response
•	There really isn't much here to explain except by way of contrast with the other three responses.
, <b>•</b>	The genuine response isn't hard; it is prepared to receive the word of the gospel.
•	The genuine response has, so that faith can take root, to the point of withstanding tribulation.
•	The genuine response trusts in Jesus, & wins out over wealth and pleasure.
,	But the greatest difference is that the genuine response bears The amount of fruit doesn't matter; some people will be more productive than others.
