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III. MEANINGFUL CELEBRATION

- A. American independence
 - 1. Reviewing the documents, context and history
 - 2. Rejoicing in freedom proper mindset
 - 3. Gut check on tyranny: mob, the party, the majority, the minority, prejudice
 - 4. Appeal to justice the word of God
- B. The believer's independence
 - 1. Prescribed by our Lord
 - 2. Practiced from the Day of Pentecost Acts 2:46; 20:7
 - 3. A central <u>instruction</u> to the church by Paul
 - a. It can only be practiced by believing people
 - b. It is to be a memorial of Christ's death as a substitute for our lives, our freedom as a result and His resurrection as our eternal life; it is not magical, it is memorial
 - c. The manner in which it is done is of grave importance; deadly serious!
 - d. It usually followed a meal but it does not have to
 - e. It involves unleavened bread and juice
 - f. No special clothing is commanded
 - g. No special ordination is required; all are priests and all can serve
 - h. No special place, furnishings or utensils are required
 Can be celebrated as a family
 Can be done as a church gathering

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
