Exposition of Psalm 16 The Strength of Centered Affections

The Psalm is divided into three sections:

 $1-4 \sim A$ prayer for preservation, then declarations to God about David, about God's people, and about idolaters.

 $5-8 \sim$ More declarations about God's kindness to David, and David's praise of God and his commitment to keep the Lord before him.

 $9-11 \sim \text{David's joy}$ and confidence in God is prophetic. He knows the grave is not the end, and God's eternal presence is the place of eternal joy.

Each section contains strong emotive elements, heart issues,

Derek Kidner rightly says, "The theme of having one's affections centered on God give this psalm its unity and ardor."

The Psalm is profoundly Christological (typological or prophetic) 16:10

I. A Prayer to God for Preservation (1-4)

- A. The Superscription A Miktam of David
- B. Declarative Prayer
 - 1. Preserve me, O God for in you I take refuge
 - 2. I say to Yahweh, You are my Lord, I have no good apart from you
- C. Delight in God's People (3)

*Can't be God's friend and yet friends with his enemies.

- 1. Saints, holy ones –
- 2. The magnificent ones
- 3. All my delight is in them
- D. Disdain for idolaters (4)
 - 1. The sorrows of those who take another god for themselves will multiply
 - 2. David's refusals
