2 Chronicles 29:11

1. All Christians have a particular station in the Church.

- A. For the Lord has chosen you
 - **I)** God's gracious decree of election
 - 2) Identity of the Church (I Pt 2:9-10)
 - 3) The Church is separate from the World (Jn 8:44a, Col 1:13).
 - 4) We have a station in the Church because of the headship of Christ. (Col 1:18)
 - 5) Because of the headship of Christ, we have membership in the Church. (I Cor 12:27, 14; Num 12:23)
- **B.** Which is further seen when Considering the context:
 - **I)** Who is speaking and to whom is he speaking?
 - 2) So too, in the New Covenant, there are stations in the Church, according to both office and maturity.
- **C.** Uses from the Text
 - **I)** To the unbeliever: (Jn 6:37)
 - 2) To the one who professes Christ but is outside the Visible Church (Belgic Confession 28)
 - 3) To the Christian (I Thes I:2-4; Zech 4:10)

11. All Members of the Church Have Duties According to our Station.

- A. We are called to our duty because of the kingship of Christ (Psa 2:6; Rev 1:6).
- **B.** The duties given here, as applied to the Church:
 - **1)** Stand before Him
 - a) Which reminds us that Christ is seated. (Heb 10:11-14)
 - **b)** Christ is seated, but we are standing (Lk 2:49; Pr 26:14)
 - c) We are reminded our heavenly inheritance (Eph 1:20, 2:6).
 - **d)** Let the unbeliever be warned. (Jn 3:18b-19)
 - e) The presence of the Triune God in holy worship (Psa 29:2b; Psa 67:1; Zeph 3:17)
 - f) God's presence in common life (Heb 13:5)
 - g) Uses from the Point (Psa 100:2b)
 - 2) Serve Him
 - **a)** The focus of holy worship is upon God.

- **b)** The focus of common life (Col 3:23-24)
- **c)** Uses from the Point (1 Pt 4:10; Mt 25:37-40; Psa 100:2a)
- **3)** *Minister to Him* (Isa 61:6a; Psa 50:12; Mal 3:8-10)
- 4) And burn incense
 - **a)** We are to pray along with the elder leading praying in worship, which is confirmed when you as the congregation say *Amen*. (HC 129)
 - **b)** We are to pray with and for one another. (Jms 5:16)

111. We Are to Encourage One Another to Fulfill our Duties.

- **A.** The tone of our encouragement My sons
 - 1) Hezekiah did not say, My subjects. (Philemon 1:8-9a).
 - 2) The Lord speaks to us in the Law as a Father to His children (Pr 3:1-2)
- **B.** The cause of our exhortation (v 10)
 - **I)** Not from self-righteousness (I Cor II:I).
 - 2) Rather from Love for the Lord (Isa 9:7) and Love for the Church (Psa 69:9a) and The advancing of His Kingdom (Mt 5:16)
- **C.** The content of our exhortation (LC 99)
 - **I)** Warning Do not be negligent now
 - 2) The Exhortation The Lord has chosen you to ... (Eph 4:15-16)
 - 3) Reminder of the blessings, privileges and comforts of obedience *The Lord has chosen you*
- D. We cannot do others duties for them. (Phil 2:12b; WCF 16.4)
- E. We are not to go beyond our jurisdiction (2 Chr 26:16-18)
 - **1)** A mark of true reformation is the recognition of the limitation of one's own authority.
 - 2) Spheres of Jurisdiction: Family, Church (WCF 31.3, 5), State
 - 3) Disagreement does not always necessitate rebuke (1 Cor 1:10)
- F. How is such encouragement and exhortation be received? (v 12; Psa 141:5; Pr 27:17)
- **G.** Uses from the Text
 - **1)** The duties of elders and members
 - 2) The duties of parents and children
 - 3) Our duties toward one another
 - **4)** We are to look to the Lord Christ Jesus
