WLC Q. 103. Which is the first commandment? A. The first commandment is, Thou shalt have no other gods before me. **WLC Q. 104.** What are the duties required in the first commandment? A. The duties required in the first commandment are, the knowing and acknowledging of God to be the only true God, and our God; and to worship and glorify him accordingly, by thinking, meditating, remembering, highly esteeming, honouring, adoring, choosing, loving, desiring, fearing of him; believing him; trusting, hoping, delighting, rejoicing in him; being zealous for him... **WLC Q. 105** What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are...carnal delights and joys; corrupt, blind, and indiscreet zeal; lukewarmness, and deadness in the things of God... **WLC Q. 110.** What are the reasons annexed to the second commandment...are, besides God's sovereignty over us, and propriety in us, his fervent zeal for his own worship, and his revengeful indignation against all false worship, as being a spiritual whoredom; accounting the breakers of this commandment such as hate him, and threatening to punish them into divers generations; and esteeming the observers of it such as love him and keep his commandments, and promising mercy to them unto many generations.
