WLC Q. 191. What do we pray for in the second petition? A. In the second petition, (which is, Thy kingdom come,) acknowledging ourselves and all mankind to be by nature under the dominion of sin and Satan, we pray, that the kingdom of sin and Satan may be destroyed, the gospel propagated throughout the world, **the Jews called** [...] that **Christ would rule in our hearts here**, and **hasten the time of his second coming**, and **our reigning with him for ever**: and that he would be pleased so to **exercise the kingdom of his power in all the world, as may best conduce to these ends.**

WLC Q. 74. What is adoption? A. Adoption is an act of the free grace of God, in and for his only Son Jesus Christ, whereby all those that are justified are received into the number of his children, have his name put upon them, the Spirit of his Son given to them, are under his fatherly care and dispensations, admitted to all the liberties and privileges of the sons of God, made heirs of all the promises, and fellow-heirs with Christ in glory. **WLC Q. 21.** Did man continue in that estate wherein God at first created him? A. Our first parents being left to the freedom of their own will, through the temptation of Satan, transgressed the commandment of God, in eating the forbidden fruit, and thereby fell from the estate of innocency wherein they were created. **WLC Q. 22.** Did all mankind fall in that first transgression? A. The covenant being made with Adam, as a public person, not for himself only, but for his posterity; all mankind descending from him by ordinary generation, sinned in him, and fell with him in that first transgression. **WLC Q. 23.** Into what estate did the fall bring mankind? A. The fall brought mankind into an estate of sin and misery.
