Pray With Jesus: When You Are Disappointed Psalm 8

"I Dreamed a Dream"

- Life has a way of killing dreams
 - Fantine in the musical version of Victor Hugo's novel, *Les Misérables*
 - "I dreamed a dream in days gone by..."
- ❖ All of us have dreams that haven't come true
 - this leads to disappointment and discouragement
 - Psalm 107 gives a pattern of prayer to all who are disappointed with life

Four Faces of Disappointment

- ❖ The four historical snapshots in vv. 4-32 also provide a picture of our spiritual condition apart from Christ
- **Homelessness and Hunger** (vv. 4-9)
 - Israel's experience as God leads her out of Egyptian captivity and she begins her journey to the Promised Land

- sometimes the open doors God puts in front of us lead to what seem like disappointing, desert times
- through all of this, God always has a plan for our good and His glory
- all of us would be homeless and hungry apart from God who is our only true home
- **pray WITH Jesus** by thanking Him for the way God has delivered you from your distress

Captivity (vv. 10-16)

- people who are sitting in darkness and the shadow of death, prisoners in affliction, clapped in irons, sentenced to hard labor (self-inflicted wounds)
- all who are in Christ have been delivered from the prison house of sin
- **pray WITH Jesus** by thanking Him for the way He has shattered the bronze door of your heart and cut the iron bars that caused you to resist Jesus
- **❖** People who suffer affliction because of their own iniquity (vv. 17-22)
 - a bleak, dire picture of people whose sinful stubbornness brings them right up to the gates of death
 - the hedonistic paradox: those who pursue pleasure tend to experience the least pleasure
 - only God can raise us from our dead condition
 - if you are IN CHRIST, you know that God has saved you from the gates of death by that very life-giving Word (1 Peter 1:23)
 - **pray WITH Jesus** by thanking Him for your salvation!

- **People who are in "deep waters"** (vv. 23-32)
 - it's likely that at one time or another, we've all been in some sort of "deep water"
 - such "deep waters" inevitably lead to disappointment and disillusionment
 - cry out to the LORD in your trouble, cling to Him as you wait on Him to deliver you from distress
 - Through many dangers, toils, and snares....
 - **pray WITH** Jesus by thanking Him for His deliverance (give public testimony about this too!)

God's Love Endures

- Dreams will die, but God's love endures!
 - be on the lookout for ways to grow in your understanding and appreciation of God's great love for you
 - God will be your constant companion regardless of your circumstances
- God sends sorrow as well as joy, hardship as well as material blessing
 - God's ways are not our ways (Romans 11:33-36)
 - who would ever dream up that God's pathway to life would require the death of His own Son?
- ❖ It is this Son **WITH** whom we can pray through all the highs and lows of life
 - take it to the Lord in prayer!

- **pray WITH Jesus** and let Him help you focus on things that are eternal and which transcend the heartaches of this life
- ❖ There is nothing you are going through that Jesus hasn't experienced firsthand before you
 - there is nothing that touches you that hasn't first passed through the hands of God
 - Whoever is wise, let him attend to these things; let them consider the steadfast love of the LORD. (v. 43)

Personal Reflection

- 1. Did you ever have a dream die? How did that effect you?
- 2. Think of a time when you or someone you know turned a dying dream into a blessing. How does the memory of that sustain and encourage you to apply the wisdom of Psalm 107?
- 3. What sorts of things might God want to teach you through disappointment?
- 4. Look at v. 15 of this psalm. What effect does giving thanks to God in spite of our painful circumstances have on our hearts?
- 5. Why should we share how God has proven his faithfulness to us with other Christians (v. 32)? How can you do this more effectively?
- 6. Pray Psalm 107 **WITH** Jesus by committing your disappointments to Him and thanking Him for past blessings.
