

#### THE MAIN POINT OF SONG 2:8–3:11

Believers, the longings and delights of committed romance are worthy of deep reflection, since they're designed to reflect our longings for the God who is eternally committed to us.

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- 2. Christians, reflect on the way that every committed romance pictures human history.

Christians, say with the bride, "Behold, he comes!" (2:8) Christians, say with the bride, "I am His; He is mine" (2:16). Christians, reflect with the bride on the glad Wedding Day (3:11).
