The Body of Christ, Spiritual Gifts, and Spiritual Maturity, Part 12 "Love does not Seek Its Own" 1 Corinthians 13:5

The Apostle's Teaching on the Characteristics of Love – Overview:

- 1. Everything in these verses is behavioral.
- 2. Paul is interested to apply these things especially in relationships in the body of Christ.
- 3. Paul begins his portrait of love as it shows itself amidst the sins and offenses of a fallen world.
- 4."Love" Gk. AGAPE
- 5. These things are impossible to the flesh! cf. Gal. 5:16-26

Love does not seek its own; love seeks the good and the interests of others!

1. Love does not Seek Its Own

"love...does not seek its own"

- (1) Defined:
 - Literally: "does not seek its own things"

- ESV: "does not insist on its own way"

- Not busied, preoccupied with one's own interests
- Not striving for one's own interest or advantage
- It is not selfish; it is not self-absorbed

Note: There *is* a proper "self-interest," but it is a self-interest subdued and reined in by the gospel and by the lordship of Christ and the glory of Christ.

- A parallel reference:
- 1 Cor. 10:24

"Let no one seek his own, but each one the other's well-being."

- Context: Paul counsels against an abuse of Christian liberty
- Engaging in an activity concerning which I have liberty of conscience, but offending my brother who is of a weaker conscience.
- An activity may be lawful for me according to my conscience, but not helpful or edifying to my brother!

(2) Fleshed out:

- -1- When I am preoccupied with my own interests, I am not able to think on the interests or the good of others!
- -2- When I am preoccupied and busied with my own interests, I am serving myself, not Jesus!

-3- When I am preoccupied and busied with my own interests, in some significant measure I will be oblivious to, disinterested in body life.

That one who is pre-occupied with his or her own interests always stays in *relative* isolation. Not vitally involved with the Body of Christ.

- A common form: One who gravitates to "cliques"
- In its extreme: The spiritual "loner"

2. Love seeks the Good, the Interests of Others!

The Corresponding Positive Operation of Love:

- (1) Love is careful to "think on the things of others," not taken up with one's own things.
- (2) Love serves and cares for the needs and interests of other brothers or sisters:
- (3) Love actively seeks the good, the well-being of other brothers and sisters.
- (4) For these reasons, love is attuned to body life:

Love sees every member as vital!

Love is interested in others in the Body of Christ; wants to bring encouragement to others! Love is never a "loner," a "maverick." The "loner" really cares only about his own things.
