- I. Introduction. Num. 21:4-9 I Co. 10:9-11
- II. You need deliverance from the venom of sin.
 - A. You have sinned.
 - 1. The children of Israel sinned by grumbling against God. Num. 21:4-5
 - 2. Grumbling is no small sin. I Co. 10:9 Phil. 2:14ff
 - 3. Sin has infected every member of the human race. Rom. 3:23 1:21 5:12 Isa. 53:6
 - B. The venom of your sin is deadly. Ro. 6:23 I Co. 15:56a
 - 1. God sent fiery serpents as judgement for Israel's sin. Num. 21:6
 - 2. Physical death illustrates the judgment of spiritual death. II Th. 1:9 Mt. 25:46 Heb. 9:27
 - C. Some are bitten and don't even know it. Phil. 3:8-9
- III. God has provided a remedy for your healing.
 - A. God graciously provided a way of deliverance for the Israelites. Num. 21:7-8
 - 1. The people repent and cry out to God for relief. Num. 21:7
 - 2. Moses mediates, interceding with the LORD on their behalf. Num. 21:7b
 - 3. The Lord answers and provides a remedy. Num. 21:8
 - B. We too must cry out to God for a remedy. I Tim. 2:5 Heb. 8:6 9:15 12:24
 - 1. We must repent.
 - 2. We must look to the One who can intercede with the LORD on our behalf.
 - 3. We need a divine remedy.
 - C. God's deliverance comes through the same agency as His judgment. 3:14
 - 1. God chose a serpent (the agent of poisoning and death) as the means of Israel's deliverance.
 - 2. God chose a man (though death came through a man) as the means by which those who were dead in sin can receive life. I Co. 15:21 Ro. 8:3 He. 2:14-17
 - D. As the serpent was lifted up, so the Son of Man must be lifted up. v. 14b
 - 1. The Son had to be *lifted up* by wicked men upon a cross. 3:14 <u>12:32-34</u> 8:28 Mark 8:31 Luke 24:7 I Jo. 3:5 II Co. 5:21 Ga. 3:13 I Pe. 3:18 Isa. 53:4-5 I Cor. 15:55-57
 - 2. The Son was also lifted up and exalted by God the Father in His resurrection and ascension. 20:17 17:5 6:62 Acts 2:33 5:31 Phil. 2:9 Eph. 1:20 Isa. 52:13
 - 3. We continue to lift up the Son of Man. 12:32.
- IV. Look (believe) to the one God has lifted up and He will heal (save) you. v. 15 Nu. 21:9
 - A. God's remedy is simple.
 - 1. All the Israelites needed to do was look.
 - 2. There is nothing for you to do but look to Christ in faith. 3:15-16

- B. God's remedy is sufficient.
 - 1. God offered that any who would look upon the serpent would live.
 - 2. Christ's healing death is of infinite value and is freely offered to all. 3:16 I Cor. 6:9-11
- C. God's remedy is effective: all who look are saved. v. 15
 - 1. Every bitten Israelite who looked upon the brass serpent lived. Num. 21:9
 - 2. Every sinner who looks in faith upon Christ lives. 3:16 6:37b Ro. 10:9-13 Mt. 4:23-25 9:35 15:29-31
- D. God's remedy is exclusive. 14:6 Acts 4:12
 - 1. There was no other way for the Jews to be healed.
 - 2. Jesus Christ is the only way sin's sting can be removed. 14:6 Ro. 3:20 Phil. 3:8-9
- E. God's remedy is enduring. 6:37 10:28 11:25-26
 - 1. Those who looked to the bronze serpent did not die of snakebite.
 - 2. Those who look to Christ receive eternal life. v. 15b-17 5:26 11:25-26 1:4 10:28
- F. God's remedy is personal.
 - 1. Every bitten Israelite had to look for himself.
 - 2. You must look to Christ for yourself.
- G. God's remedy is urgently needed.
 - 1. Those in Israel who refused to look perished.
 - 2. You must look to Christ now.
- V. Conclusion: We lift up Christ before you today. Look to Him and live!
 - A. We lift up Christ to those of you who have not yet believed. Why would anyone refuse to look? I Cor. 1:18ff 2:14
 - B. We continue to lift up Christ before Christians: keep looking to Christ.
 - C. Christians, keep lifting up the crucified and risen Lord! Jo. 12:32
