Studying

- 1. Define the passage. Where does the passage begin? Where does it end?
- 2. Understand the details
 - a. What is the literary genre? What is the historical context?
 - b. Do you sufficiently understand the doctrines involved?
 - c. Do you sufficiently understand the people and places?
 - d. Any important or difficult words/phrases?
- 3. What is the main point for your passage?
 - a. If it is too big or too complicated, think about splitting up the passage.
- 4. How does this relate to Christ?
- 5. How should we apply the main point? (e.g. attitude, action)
 - a. Consider the differences of Christians vs. non-Christians

Communicating

- 1. The passage needs to matter to you
- 2. Communicate the main point
 - a. Structure according to the main point
- 3. Who is the audience (age, maturity, faith)
- 4. How much time do I have?
 - a. Time affects how deep and far you can go
- 5. Any relevant circumstances?
