Introduction

- 1. There is a profound spiritual profit when we believe the truth of God's Word expressed in the Apostles' Creed: "I know that I am righteous in Christ, before God."
- 2. This truth of justification is so important to consider.

The Forensic Idea

- 1. Justification is the forensic (legal) act of God declaring to us that we are righteous.
 - a. We must think of ourselves before God the Judge in the courtroom of heaven.
 - b. God's declaration to us is that we are forgiven and righteous!
- 2. This truth is amazing and beautiful because it sets us free in our experience.
 - a. This truth speaks to us about our relationship with God a relationship of friendship. Romans 5:1 This is amazing and overwhelming.
 - b. It is so important to understand this truth rightly because so many are denying this truth today.

The Alien Righteousness...how can God declare me righteous when personally I am not?

- 1. Not because God can simply pardon our sins or because I am righteous myself.
 - a. Let us remember that God cannot simply pardon or declare us righteous and does not.
 - b. Galatians 2:16 teaches clearly that a man is not justified by his own works.
- 2. The only basis for our being declared righteous is the alien righteousness of Jesus Christ.
 - a. The only basis of our justification is the perfect obedience of Jesus Christ in our place. Romans 5:19
 - b. God has imputed this righteousness to me also a legal term.

The Means of Faith...Faith is the only means of justification.

- 1. What is faith? Faith is the gift of God whereby we are united to Christ and we embrace Christ and appropriate all His benefits. Heidelberg Catechism End of Answer 60 & Answer 61
- 2. Let us embrace this truth of justification by faith alone.
