- **B.** When you trust mankind, your heart is turned away from the Lord. v. 5b <u>2:13</u> 5:23 For my people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, to hew for themselves cisterns, Broken cisterns that can hold no water.

 - 2. Trust in anyone or anything else is nothing less than idolatry (spiritual adultery). 3:2,6-10 2:20

- C. If you put your trust in people instead of God, your life will wither away. v. 6
 - 1. You will be desolate and hopeless.
 - 2. Such was the condition of Israel as Jeremiah wrote -- exile. 8:13 11:16 1:15 25:9 Dt. 28:15ff 29:22-23 Ezek. 17:8-10 19:10-13
 - 3. Such is the condition of all humanity apart from the waters of divine grace. Ps. 129:6
- D. Like Israel we are prone to trust man instead of God.
 - 1. Our nation is guilty of self reliance rather than dependence upon God.
 - 2. Many professing Christians are double-minded. Js. 1:8 4:8 Ps. 119:113
 - 3. The church itself has neglected the biblical means for ministry and has become reliant upon worldly methodologies. II Tim. 3:16-17 4:1ff I Co. 1:18,21 2:2
