Hebrews

1. Angelic beings (demons) are often worshipped in false religions. Sometimes this is obvious to the participants, and sometimes it is not.
 - A. To see how common this was, look up the following examples of people being led astray into the doctrine of demons: Deuteronomy 17:17-21, Leviticus 17:7, 1 Corinthians 10:20-22, and 1 Timothy 4:1-2
 - B. Read over the remainder of 1 Timothy 4 to see what Timothy is supposed to do in response to the dire warning of demonic doctrine coming his way and what you should do as well.

2. In Genesis 3:1-6 we get an idea of how a demon, in this case Satan Himself, might operate to draw people away.
 - A. Read the verses, and notice that Satan does not necessarily seek to be exalted, instead He wants Eve to exalt who? _____.
 - B. What about today, do we see demons being worshipped per say, or is it more common to see people desiring to set their own rules and thus rejecting God as the Law Giver? Think of some practical examples.

3. Stringent rule keeping and religious practice can come across as God-honoring, however if we think back to the Pharisees who were known for their attention to rule keeping, we find that God was not pleased with them at all. Read John 8:39-47 Jesus calls them children of _____. The Pharisees believed that they were keeping the rules well enough, and believed themselves to be the true followers of God, yet they were following Satan. Does this still happen in our time? Think of some examples.

4. For the most part, angels remain a mystery to us. God's word does mention them from time to time, but there is not a lot of emphasis and detail given to them. Have you been around unbelievers, or even Christians, who put too much emphasis on angels? How would you respond to a professing Christian who prays to angels?
