### I. The **SETTING** (Luke 10:21-24)

- A. There are those who are spiritually \_\_\_\_\_ and reject Christ as Messiah and those who had seen the \_\_\_\_\_ and believed in Christ.
- B. Christ referred to those who were not saved as \_\_\_\_\_ and those who were saved as \_\_\_\_\_

\* How has God hidden the knowledge of the Savior from those who do not get saved? (John 12:36- 42)

### II. The **First QUESTION** (Luke 10:25)

- \* How did Jesus respond to the initial question?
- \* Would the Scriptures provide the answer he needed? (John 5:39-40)
- \* How does the lawyer respond?
- \* How does Christ respond to the lawyer's answer?
- \* Why did Christ give this command? (Lev 18:5)
- \* What does the Law ultimately do?

### III. The **Second QUESTION** (Luke 10:29)

- \* Why did the lawyer ask the second question?
- \* Can a man justify himself before God? (Rom 3:19-20, 28; Gal 2:16)

#### IV. The **PARABLE** (Luke 10:30-35)

- \* Where is Jericho relative to Jerusalem?
- \* What happens to the man?
- \* How did the priest respond to the dying man?
- \* How did the Levite respond to the dying man?
- \* How did the Samaritan respond?

#### V. The **ANSWER** (Luke 10:36-37)

- \* What question did Christ pose to the lawyer?
- \* How did the lawyer respond?
- \* So how did Christ answer the question?
- \* Was Christ using the parable as a prescription for eternal life?

#### VI. The **PEOPLE**

The Priest and the Levite -

- \* What attitude did their actions display?
- \* Can this be true of you and me?

The Lawyer -

- \* What posture did his questions display?
- \* Can this be true of you and me?

The Samaritan -

- \* How would the Jews in the audience be offended?
- \* What 5 characteristics did this man display?
- \* Who does the Samaritan picture for us?      \* What does this mean to you?
