Sermon: **Creed article 2 and Heidelberg Catechism #29,30**

The believer's confession of Jesus as his only and complete Savior.

We see:

1. The old covenant Joshuas were saviors, but Jesus brings complete salvation as the new covenant Joshua.
2. By faith we accept Jesus as the only Savior, for in Him alone is there complete salvation from all our sins.

The Apostles' Creed

{The articles of our common and undoubted Christian faith}

1. *I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.*
2. *And in Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, our Lord;*
3. *Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary;*
4. *Suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried;*
He descended into hell.
5. *On the third day He arose from the dead;*
6. *He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty;*
7. *From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.*
8. *I believe in the Holy Spirit;*
9. *I believe a holy catholic Christian Church, the communion of saints;*
10. *The forgiveness of sins;*
11. *The resurrection of the body;*
12. *And the life everlasting. Amen.*

The Heidelberg Catechism

29. Q. Why is the Son of God called *Jesus*, that is, Savior?

A. Because He saves us from all our sins,[1] and because salvation is not to be sought or found in anyone else.[2]

[1] *Matt. 1:21; Heb. 7:25. [2] Is. 43:11; John 15:4, 5; Acts 4:11, 12; 1 Tim. 2:5.*

30. Q. Do those believe in the only Savior Jesus who seek their salvation and well-being from saints, in themselves, or anywhere else?

A. No. Though they boast of Him in words, they in fact deny the only Savior Jesus.[1] For one of two things must be true: either Jesus is not a complete Savior, or those who by true faith accept this Savior must find in Him all that is necessary for their salvation.[2]

[1] *1 Cor. 1:12, 13; Gal. 5:4. [2] Col. 1:19, 20; 2:10; 1 John 1:7.*


