- Jesus as the Source of Living Water 2.
- 3. Jesus as the Prophet—4:16-24
 - Initially perceived through His intimate knowledge of her past and present life-- 4:16-18 a.
 - Samaritan's view of "THE" Prophet—the "Taheb" -- 4:19 b.
 - Could Jesus solve the age-old controversy that separated Jews from Samaritans? The Place C. of worship? 4:20
 - Believed God directed his people to worship at a particular location-- Deuteronomy 1) 12:4-5
 - Jews—Jerusalem 2 Chron. 6:6 2)
 - 3) Samaritans—Mount Gerizim
 - Jesus' Solution—a short course on "True Worship" d.
 - Worship can occur anywhere. 4:21 1) 2)
 - Worship is to be based on truth, not ignorance. 4:22
 - Samaritans were ignorant about God a)
 - The Jews had greater revelation b)
 - Salvation is of the Jews—Isaiah 53:4-6 c)
 - Worship involves pursuing a personal relationship with God the Father—4:21, 23 3)
 - Both Jews and Samaritans worshiped in the abstract. a)
 - Christianity is not a religions, but a relationship with the living God! b)
 - Worship balances "spirit" and "truth" 4)
 - a) Samaritans—enthusiastic heresy
 - b) Judaism—dead orthodoxy
- Jesus as the MESSIAH—4:25-26 4.
 - The Woman's Conclusion—4:25 a.
 - Jesus' Proclamation: I AM Messiah!! 4:26 b.
