- A. After these things I saw
- B. And behold a great multitude, which no one is able to number Gen.12:3; 22:17-18
- C. From every people and tribe and people and tongue Rev. 5:9
- D. Standing before the throne and before the Lamb
 - 1. Yes, the answer to Rev. 6:17 But more, they stand in His presence, before His throne
 - 2. The Father and the Son are worshiped together as the one true God! The Christology of Revelation soars!
- E. Clothed with white robes
 - 1. Purity ~ Rev. 7:14
 - 2. Victory ~ Rev. 3:4-5; 6:6:11
- F. Palm branches in their hands1. Feast of booths ~ Lev. 23:40, 43
 - 2. Psalm Sunday ~ Jn 12:12-13

II. Salvation Belongs to our God (7:10)

A. They cry with a loud voice

- B. Salvation to our God, who sits on the throne and to the Lamb
 - "belongs" is probably the right gloss
 "This is common doxology formula that leaves out verbs
 - 2. "Salvation" is more here than forgiveness GB Caird suggests "victory"

The vision of salvation that we have in Scripture is deliverance and rescue, reconciliation and forgiveness, and final victory.

And this belongs to God who sits on the throne and to the Lamb

- 1) It is from a sovereign God
- 2) It is from a suffering and victorious Lamb!
