Notes:

to come, <sup>6</sup> and then have fallen away, to restore them again to repentance, since *they are crucifying once* again the Son of God to their own harm and holding him up to contempt. <sup>7</sup> For land that has drunk the rain that often falls on it, and produces a crop useful to those for whose sake it is cultivated, receives a blessing from God. <sup>8</sup> But if it bears thorns and thistles, it is worthless and near to being cursed, and its end is to be burned. ... <sup>26</sup> For *if we go on sinning deliberately* after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there *no longer remains a sacrifice for sins*, <sup>27</sup> but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries.

Beware Defying & Reviling what is Clearly from God

## Key Idea:

If we fail to turn from grumbling it leads to defiance of the living God; this is the path that leads to death.

Conversely, the importance of cultivating a thankful, repentant heart can not be overestimated; this is the path of life.

#### Isaiah 66:2b

"...this is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word."

The reason for this life is to give us an opportunity to turn back to God, therefore...

Every painful struggle is meant to teach us that we are rebels under a sentence of death and we need to turn back to God through Jesus the savior;

And every good gift is to teach us that God is good, merciful and kind and we would be foolish not to turn back to Him.

## **Atonement, Forgiveness & Fellowship**

(In the Context of Rebellion)

- > Thankfulness & Repentance... (Clear Implications...)
- > 24-25 Congregation...
  - What about Leviticus 4? (Bull Sin Offering)
  - New: **Bull** Burnt Offering... (Flour, Oil & Wine)
  - o Different: *Male Goat* Sin Offering; (Leviticus 4:14)
- then if it was done unintentionally without the knowledge of the congregation, all the congregation shall offer one bull from the herd for a burnt offering, a pleasing aroma to the Lord, with its grain offering and its drink offering, according to the rule, and one male goat for a sin offering. 25 And the priest shall make atonement...
  - > **26-29** Individual... (Same Lev. 4:28: *Female Goat*)

## Severity for Those with a Grumbling, Defiant Heart

<sup>30</sup> But the person who does anything with a high hand, whether he is native or a sojourner, reviles the Lord, and that person shall be cut off from among his people. 31 Because he has despised the word of the Lord and has broken his commandment, that person shall be utterly cut off; his iniquity shall be on him."

What is Meant by "High Handed" Sins?

"The same phrase describes the attitude of the Israelites to Pharaoh and the Egyptians at the time of the Exodus (e.g., Exod. 14:8; Num. 33:3, usually translated as "boldly," or even "defiantly")" ||

o **Reviles** the LORD (to speak about someone in a very critical or insulting way)

Notes:

o Despises the LORD's Word

## Case Law (32-36)

<sup>32</sup> While the people of Israel were in the wilderness, they found a man gathering sticks on the Sabbath day. 33 And those who found him gathering sticks brought him to Moses and Aaron and to all the congregation. 34 They put him in custody, because it had not been made clear what should be done to him. 35 And the Lord said to Moses, "The man shall be put to death; all the congregation shall stone him with stones outside the camp." <sup>36</sup> And all the congregation brought him outside the camp and stoned him to death with stones, as the Lord commanded Moses.

Not clear what should be done to him?

#### **Exodus 35:2b-3**

...on the seventh day you shall have a Sabbath of solemn rest, holy to the Lord. Whoever does any work on it shall be put to death. 3 You shall kindle no fire in all your dwelling places on the Sabbath day."

- Death Penalty for Picking Up Sticks?! No...
- > The Death Penalty is for Contempt for God's Authority

## Matthew 12:24 (Beelzebul), 31-32 (Jesus Casting Out Demons)

<sup>31</sup> Therefore I tell you, every sin and blasphemy will be forgiven people, but the blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven. 32 And whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come.
