#### HANNAH'S PROPHETIC PRAYER

"The LORD will judge the ends of the earth; he will give strength to his king and exalt the horn of his anointed." **1 Samuel 2:10** 

When Hannah prayed this prayer, there were no kings in Israel. Wonderfully, we have a prophetic utterance of Jesus Christ to come. In the final judgment, the Lord God will judge the ends of the earth; and He will do so through His anointed King, Jesus Messiah.

The Lord Jesus came to Israel in a gentle and lowly manner (Matt 11:29); so meek was He that He would not break a bruised reed or quench a smoking flax (Matt 12:19-20). Whenever Jesus, as perfect Man, required power or strength to accomplish work for His Father's glory, He relied upon the strength given Him from above. As a result, Christ's heavenly Father has enlarged (*exalted*) the kingdom (*horn*) of His Messiah (*anointed*) so the eternal kingdom can rule in the hearts and minds of redeemed sinners.

Jesus Christ is the eternal King, whether one acknowledges its truth or not. When God saves us by His grace, we become new creations in Christ (2 Cor 5:17); and therefore, the reality of salvation in, by and through Jesus Christ is made alive in our once dead souls. We don't have to make Jesus Lord of our lives as if it were some sort of separate work we determine to do in order to merit salvation. To think such a thing is absolutely absurd! Jesus *is* King of kings and Lord of lords, eternally and infinitely. Because Jesus is Lord and King, our spiritually blind eyes were opened to the holiness of His rule and reign, and thus, repentance is a grace and result of regeneration, not a work to justify ourselves before Him. When His kingdom and sovereign reign is revealed in our hearts, faith is a grace which trusts in Christ alone to transfer us from the kingdom of darkness into the glorious realm of Christ's marvelous light.

The adversaries of the Lord, He'll shatter and He'll break; He'll judge them by His mighty Word In that Day for Christ's sake.
