 - a. improvident: if you gamble with your wages (see 1Tm.5:8; food, clothing, shelter)
 - b. imprudent: if you gamble with your savings (see Gal.6:7f; seed corn)
 - c. unmerciful: if you gamble with your alms (see Eph.4:28; meet pressing needs)

C. YOU SHALL NOT COVET (#10; Ex20:17; Rm7:7f; 13:9 /Lk3:14; 2C12:10; Phil.4:11; 1Tm6:6f,8; Hb.13:5)
