Biblical Points About Talking (Part 1)

| A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth: and a word spoken in due season, how good is it! (Proverbs 15:23) | |
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The tongue of the just is as choice silver: the heart of the wicked is little worth.

The lips of the righteous feed many: but fools die for want of wisdom.
(Proverbs 10:20-21)

In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: but he that refraineth his lips is wise. (Proverbs 10:19)

He that hath knowledge spareth his words: and a man of understanding is of an excellent spirit. (Proverbs 17:27)

For in the multitude of dreams and many words there are also divers vanities: but fear t hou God. (Ecclesiastes 5:7)

A fool also is full of words: a man cannot tell what shall be; and what shall be after him, who can tell him?

The labour of the foolish wearieth every one of them, because he knoweth not how to go to the city. (Ecclesiastes 10:14-15)

...but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more;

And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you;

That ye may walk honestly toward them that are without, and that ye may have lack of nothing. (1 Thessalonians 4:10-12)

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Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood, and hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen. (Revelations 1:5-6)

The princes refrained talking, and laid their hand on their mouth. The nobles held their peace, and their tongue cleaved to the roof of their mouth. (Job 29:9-10) A soft answer turneth away wrath: but griev-5.____ ous words stir up anger. (Proverbs 15:1) The words of wise men are heard in quiet more than the cry of him that ruleth among fools. (Ecclesiastes 9:17) The words of a wise man's mouth are gracious: but the lips of a fool will swallow up himself. (Ecclesiastes 10:12) Let your speech be alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man. (Colossians 4:6) Who whet their tongue like a sword, and bend their bows to shoot their arrows, even bitter words: But God shall shoot at them with an arrow; suddenly shall they be wounded. 7. So they shall make their own tongue to fall upon themselves: (Psalm 64:3, 7-8) The tongue of the wise useth knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools poureth out foolishness. (Proverbs 15:12) The words of the wise are as goads, and as nails fastened by the masters of assemblies, 8. which are given from one shepherd. And further, by these, my son, be admonished: (Ecclesiastes 12:11-12) And I, brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom, declaring unto you the testimony of God. And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God. (1 Corinthians 2:1, 4-5)



9. But I will come to you shortly, if the Lord will, and will know, not the speech of them which are puffed up, but the power. For the kingdom of God is not in word, but in (1 Corinthians 4:19-20) power. Seeing then that we have such hope, we use 10. great plainness of speech: (2 Corinthians 3:12) Great is my boldness of speech toward you, 11. great is my glorying of you: I am filled with comfort, I am exceeding joyful in all our tribulation. (2 Corinthians 7:4) 3954 parrhesia all out spokenness, i.e. frankness, bluntness; by impl. assurance 12. In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you. (Titus 2:7-8) Seest thou a man that is hasty in his words? there is more hope of a fool than of him. (Proverbs 29:20) 13. Will ye speak wickedly for God? and talk deceitfully for him? (Job 13:7) Shall not they teach thee, and tell thee, and utter words out of their heart? (Job 8:10) The words of his mouth were smoother than butter, but war was in his heart: his words were softer than oil, yet were they drawn swords. Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved. (Psalm 55:21-22) 14. My words shall be of the uprightness of my heart: and my lips shall utter knowledge clearly. If thou canst answer me, set thy words in order before me, stand up. (Job 33:3, 5)
