The Word of God Hebrews 4:12-13 Reading: Psalm 119:9-16

I *love* the Bible!

I can say **w/o** exaggeration that from the time I was a *young adult*, my goal has been for God to *shape* me & *guide* me through His Scriptures.

Faith, marriage, parenting, work, finances, priorities, values, world-view... The Bible has **never** *let me down*!

As a pastor, I've taught, time & again, that Gods' Word is *inspired*, *inerrant*, *clear*, *sufficient* & *authoritative*.

It's *inspired*. That word lit. means *God-breathed*. Which means God is the Bible's ultimate *author*.

Which means the Bible is *inerrant*. God doesn't make mistakes or He isn't God.

The Bible is *clear*. You can *read* it & *get* it.

The Bible is *sufficient*. The Apostle Peter said it contains all things *pertaining to life & godliness*. The psalmist wrote that *the sum of Thy word is truth*.

And because the Bible is *God breathed, w/o error, inexcusably clear & always sufficient,* God's word is *authoritative*. It is *morally binding*. You *ignore* God's word to your *peril*!

Let's return to Hebrews 4:11-13 (focus on vv.12-13).

You've probably read **v.12** all by itself in a lesson about the Bible.

But you need to see that **vv. 12 & 13** are tightly bound together and they come at the end of a long warning that began like this in **3:7** – Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says, "Today if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts."

And today we will see that if you *harden* your heart, that *voice* you hear will *cut* you to the quick, *lay open* your sin, & bring you to *justice*.

This verse is not simply about **God's Word**, it's about the *futility* of *rejecting* **God's word**.

A warning to those who think they can ignore God forever.

- 1. The penetrating power of God's word (v.12).
- 2. The unmasking power of God's gaze (v.13).

If you've been *ignoring* God, consider the *penetrating power* of His word(v.12).

- 1. I love this saying: "God has spoken, and He hasn't mumbled!" God speaks in every place and to every generation.
 - a. He speaks thru *nature*, thru *conscience*, thru *Scripture* & thru His *Son*.
 - i. God speaks thru *nature*: **Psa 19:1&2** The heavens are telling of the glory of God; and their expanse is declaring the work of His hands; day to day pours forth speech, and night to night reveals knowledge.
 - ii. God speaks thru your *conscience*: Rom 2:15 [The Gentiles] ... show the work of the Law written in their hearts, their conscience bearing witness and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending them.
 - iii. God speaks thru *Scripture*: **Psa 19:7** *The Law of the Lord is perfect, restoring the soul.*
 - iv. And the Letter to the Hebrews begins like this: God speaks thru His Son, Jesus Christ: Heb 1:1&2 God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, thru whom also He made the world.
 - b. God *spoke* to ancient Israel with a command to *enter* the Promised Land. They *ignored* Him and wandered in the wilderness!
 - c. He *spoke* in in David's day, He *spoke* to these churches in the **1**st century, and He is **still** *speaking* to the church including *our* church today. Here in Hebrews, God is *particularly* concerned w/*spiritual procrastinators* (those of you *who* listen to the *Gospel* but won't *commit* to the *Gospel*).
 - d. The Holy Spirit's warning in every generation is this (3:7, 15; 4:7): "Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your heart."

- 2. So here (12) we read **four** compelling truths about God's *word* of *warning*; His word is *living*, *active*, *piercing* & *judging*.
- 3. The word of God is **living**.
 - a. Scholars sometimes classify **OT** *Hebrew* & **NT** *Greek* as *dead languages*. **Not** according to **v.12!** ©
 - i. Our author is using *present language* God's *promises* & His *warnings* are currently & continuously *alive*! As in...*right now*.
 - ii. And God's word will be alive tomorrow! We read in **Isa 40:8** the grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever.
 - b. And because His word is *alive*, it *gives life*. All the way back in **Gen** 1 we read that *living things* produce **more** *living things!*
 - c. Be careful who you *listen* to! Is someone encouraging you to *put off* doing business with God...?
 - i. Jesus said: "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life."
 - ii. The living God speaks living words. Dead men speak dead words.
- **4.** The word of God is active. God's word doesn't wait for you, it comes to you!
 - a. And because it's active it's effective. It's so completely & perfectly effective, some the Bible "self-fulfilling." God's word does what God intends for it to do...!
 - b. **Isa 55:11** "So will My word be which goes forth from My mouth; It will **not** return to Me empty, without accomplishing what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it."
 - c. Friend, here is a sobering example of God's *active*, *self-fulling word*: when God says (Heb 3&4) that the *hard-hearted* & *unbelieving* "will *not enter My rest*," ... you can take *that* to the *bank*!

- 5. The word of God is **piercing**. More than the sharpest of blades...
 - a. Our verse uses a term that also found in the Apostle Paul's inventory of *spiritual armor* in **Eph 6**. Roman soldiers carried a short *sword* for close fighting. It was called a "*gladius*," and was one of *many* types of *swords* on the **1**st century battlefield.
 - i. Its *blade* was about **2**" *wide* & **2**' *long*, sharpened on *both edges*, weighing in at upwards of **2** *lbs*.
 - ii. The sword was worn on the *right*, secured by the same *belt* that *girded their loins* & *secured their tunic*.
 - iii. The *two-edged sword* was primarily an *offensive* weapon. And the language here claims that it is (lit.) *the sharpest of swords*.
 - b. What do you *do* with a sword? You cut things *open & apart*! The *language* of **v.12** is *graphic* it begins w/ a *spiritual wound &* illustrates it w/ a *physical* one.
 - i. God's *truth* God's *warnings* cut deep & true. Peter may have *missed* his *mark* in *Gethsemane* (& Malchus was *glad he did!*), but *God's word* never cuts *wide* or *stops short!*
 - ii. Let's take a *theological excursion* here. **V.12** refers to our *spirit* & our *soul*.
 - 1. Theologians debate whether the Bible teaches that man is *dichotomis* (**two** *essential* parts *body* & *soul*) or *trichotomos* (**three** parts *body* & *soul* & *spirt*).
 - 2. Although, on face value, our verse seems to support the *trichotomos* perspective (a **3-**part person), I don't think the author is teaching *theology*! I think he's simply trying to impress on you just how *deep* & how *precise* the *piercing power* of God's word is!

- iii. And so his claim is *reinforced* w/ this *graphic* picture of the *sword* of God's *word* laying open the most *stubborn procrastinator* or *scoffer* all the way to the *bone*...all the way to his *spirit*!
 - 1. Elsewhere, the Apostle Paul has written (1 Cor 4:5) [the Lord] will both bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and make manifest the counsels of the hearts.
- c. You get the *point right*!?! When God *speaks*, His words *cut* deep & true. The verb is "*piercing/penetrating*" & (again) it's in the *present* tense. I.e., it cuts *now*–today, and keeps on *cutting* til its work is done.
- 6. Add them all up (living, active, piercing) and what's the sum...?
 - a. God's words *judge*. He doesn't simple *expose*, He *indicts*.
 - b. Men know your *actions*, God knows your *thoughts*. But beyond that, God knows the *motives* of your *heart* (in the Bible, your *heart* is the "real, inner you" that defines & drives who you really are).
 - i. What are you *hiding* in your heart? *Impurity*, *lust*, *anger*, *unforgiveness*, *greed*, *envy*...?
 - ii. What are you *hiding* in your heart...? *Nothing*! God's word *exposes* it all & *judges* it all.

Friend, God says do not harden your heart, and God's word & warning is life giving, always active, soul piercing...& heart judging.

But if you've been *hiding* from God, then consider the *unmasking* power of His *gaze*.

- 1. What was it the boxer **Joe Louis** said...? You can run, but you can't... hide!
 - a. Joe didn't know the *half* of it... **Read v.13.**
 - b. Our verse warns *spiritual fence-sitters* that God's *gaze* is *comprehensive*, *unmasking* & *perfectly holy*.
- 2. What does God *know*? Who does God *see*? *Everything*! *Everyone*!
 - a. Bible students call this God's *omniscience*. "*Omniscience*" (lit. *all knowing*) means that God *knows* everything. And consequently, He *sees* everyone, all the time. His understanding is *completely comprehensive*.
 - b. Pastor **Kent Hughes** writes that **Heb 4:13** is the most powerful statement about God's *omniscience* in the entire Bible...
 - c. Maybe so, but it's certainly not the *only* verse! **E.g.** ...
 - i. **Psa 90:8** You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of Your presence.
 - ii. Prov 5:21 For the ways of a man are before the eyes of the Lord, and He watches all his paths. (This was written as a warning to the adulterer.)
 - iii. Turn w/ me to Mk 2:4-12 (read). Don't you *love* this account!?! There is a lot here, but today I just want you to see one *truth*:
 - **1.** $\mathbf{Vv.6-7}$ The scribes are *down on Jesus*. But they are trying to *hide it* at least *for now*.
 - 2. V.8 You can *run*, but you can't *hide*! Not when you are dealing with the Son of Man! *Immediately Jesus*, aware in His spirit that they were reasoning that way w/in themselves... This reminds us that God knows the thoughts & intentions of our hearts & so it teaches us that Jesus was *truly man* & *truly God*.

- 3. And God is **not** a *distant & indifferent* observer. Building on **v.12**, the tone in **v.13** is clearly one of *judgment*. God's holy gaze **un**masks *sinners &* their *sins*.
 - a. The key verb is (Gr.) $\tau \rho \alpha \chi \eta \lambda \iota \zeta \omega$ *laid bare (exposed)*. It has a couple of fascinating backgrounds:
 - i. The *first* is of a *wrestler* who grabs his opponent by the throat with the result that both men are *face to face*.
 - ii. The *second* background (same word) pictures an ancient courtroom practice in which a *condemned* man stands in court with a *dagger* bound beneath his *chin*, **point up**, forcing him to *look out at the court* & at those he's *wronged*.
 - b. The *point*, friend, is that God's holy gaze will bring every sin to light! *You* will see it. *God* will see it. Your *mask* will be *pulled off*.
- 4. God's gaze is a *holy gaze* because we are dealing with a *holy God* the **one** *true God*. The writer draws our thoughts to **Him** *with whom we have to* **do**.
 - a. Still *sitting* on that *Gospel fence*...?
 - b. Consider this: when you **hear** the *Gospel* and **reject** it, you are judging God! His *wisdom*, His *indictments*, His *warning*, His *plans*, His *promises*.
 - i. You've place them all in your *puny scale* & somehow found God wanting.
 - ii. But is that *smart*...?
 - c. My friend, this God, with whom we have to do, is your Creator & Judge.
 - i. **Heb 9:27** And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment,
 - ii. **Heb 10:31 -** *It is a terrifying thing to fall into the hands of the living God.*
 - iii. Heb 12:29 for our God is a consuming fire.

d. This is the One with whom we have to do – if you are coming to church carelessly, if you are hearing His promises casually, be careful who you're messing with!

The Word of God is not simply a leather-bound book on your nightstand or a techy app on your smart phone.

God speaks to us with instructions & promises.

And if you *ignore* Him, He speaks with *warnings*.

He speaks in *judgment*.

And there is **no** escaping His word or His gaze.

Don't harden you heart against God's love & grace.
