II. HOW ARE WE TO REMEMBER THE SABBATH SO WE EXPERIENCE ITS BLESSING

- A. The 4th commandment itself specifies one detail: we are not to labor
 - 1. The detail of this commandment
 - a. refers to our ordinary work of all in our household
 - b. refers to a *special work* we are to be engaged in on the Sabbath
- B. To explore how are we to remember, we will study Jesus' example
 - 1. As the Law-Keeper He has expounded the Law in His example (Matt. 5:17)
- C. Mark 2:27-28: Jesus announces that He is also (!) the Lord of the Sabbath
 - 1. His Lordship rules over all things
 - 2. He taught that the Sabbath was made (designed) for man
 - 3. He taught that we were not made for the Sabbath
 - a. Jewish teaching: no matter what, keep the Sabbath
 - b. Jesus' teaching: remember the Sabbath but without canceling mercy

- D. How did Jesus keep the Lord's Day?
 - 1. Jesus always attended the synagogue services on Sabbath: Luke 4:16
 - a. He went to teach the Word of God: Mark 1:21; 6:2; Luke 4:31; 6:6
 - 2. Jesus did works of necessity: Matt. 12:1-8
 - a. the main point of Jesus' answer in vs. 3-7
 - (1) The law is not intended to keep us from showing mercy (3-5)
 - (2) As Lawgiver, He may grant exceptions (vs. 6)
 - (3) Mercy and kindness rank higher than strict external compliance with the duties of religion (Hosea 6:6; Micah 6:8; John 7:22-24)
 - 3. Jesus performed acts of charity: Luke 13:10-17
 - a. healing on Sabbath was for Jesus not only charity: it was exposing the hypocrisy in strict religious observances
 - opposition to good deeds may have the appearance of faithfulness to and regard for strict religion yet be hypocritical
 - b. Jesus' example is directive and normative: do good is our call!
 - consider the usual action in Luke 14:1.
