Session 2 What Does the Bible Say About the Value of Women in the Church?

Titus 2:1-10

I. Introduction

- A. Women in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-28)
- B. Woman and the Fall into Sin (Genesis 3:1–21; 1 Tim. 2:13–14 [with Rom. 5:12–21])
- C. Jesus and Women (Luke 1:26–55; 2:19, 36–38, 41–51; 7:11–17, 36–50; 8:1–3, 40–56; 10:38–42; 18:1–8; 21:1–4; 23:49, 55; 24:10, 22–24)
- D. Women anointed by God's Spirit for "general office" ministry (Acts 1:12–14; 2:1–4, 17–21; see 5:14; 8:3, 12; 9:2; 16:13; 17:4, 12; 22:4) Heidelberg Catechism LD 12 (Q/A 32)

II. Ministry to Women in Paul's Letters to Timothy and Titus

- A. By pastors and elders
 - To their own wives: loving leadership and faithfulness (1 Tim. 3:2, 4–5; Titus 1:6–8)
 - To mature/older women: instruction (Titus 2:3)
 - To younger women: purity (1 Tim 5:2; Titus 2:3–4; contrast 1 Tim 1:9–10)
 - To all: honor (2 Tim 4:19, 21; Romans 16; Philippians 4:2–3)
- B. By other women
 - To widows (Acts 9:36–43; 1 Tim. 5:3–16)

- To younger wives and mothers (Titus 2:3–4)
- C. By the church (Acts 6:1–7; 1 Tim. 5:3–16)

Ministry of Women III.

A. Prayer (1 Tim 5:5; Luke 2:36–38; 1 Cor 11:5; cf. vv. 2–16)

- B. Mercy
 - To widows (1 Tim 5:16; Acts 9:36–43)
 - To the saints in general (1 Tim 5:10)
 - With deacons? (1 Tim 3:11; Rom 16:1–2)
- C. Quiet witness of pure, calm beauty (Titus 2:4–5, [8, 10]; 1 Tim 2:9–11; 1 Pet 3:1–6)
- D. Word and wisdom
 - To their children (2 Tim 1:5–6; 3:14)
 - To younger women (Titus 2:3–4)
 - To others (Acts 18:24–26 [cf. 2 Tim 4:19]; Col. 3:16)
 - But not as ordained pastors-elders-teachers (1 Tim. 2:11–15)

Session 3

Our Extraordinary God Works in Ordinary Ministry: Word and Deed Mercy Ministries

Acts 6:1-7

I. Significance of the Seven Servers in Church Growth in Acts

A. Jerusalem, Judaea-Samaria, end of earth (Acts 1:8; 8:1; 11:19–26; 13:1–4)

B. Mercy ministry supports the "growing" Word (6:7; 12:24; 19:20)

II. Back-story to the Crisis in Acts 6

A. Jesus' ministry of Word and deed (Acts 1:1-2; Luke 24:19)

- B. Pentecost (Acts 2)
 - The Holy Spirit was poured out on the whole church, not only apostles.
 - The gospel reached a diverse crowd: Jews and Gentile proselytes (converts), representing a wide variety of nationalities, languages, and cultures.
- C. Growth flowing from Pentecost
 - The church grew, devoted to the apostles' teaching, the sharing of resources, the breaking of the bread (Lord's Supper), and the prayers (2:42–47).
 - Both types of ministry—Word and mercy—were under the apostles' direct supervision (4:32–34).

III. Blessing Begets Diversity

A. Different kinds of people: language/culture, gender, race (Acts 6:1, 5)

- B. Different kinds of needs
 - Spiritual (Word), material (tables) (Acts 6:2)
 - Internal care for church members, external outreach to non-Christians.

Growth and Diversity Beget Friction (6:1) IV.

- A. Competing priorities
- B. Unintended neglect
- C. Unresolved grievance

V. Grace-Gripped Leaders (6:2–6)

- A. Grace has taught the apostles to be humble and to stay "on task"
 - Not indifferent, not demeaning, not defensive, not controlling
 - Trusting Jesus to lead and provide for his church through ordinary means
 - Focused on their central calling and task: the Word of Jesus
- B. Grace has taught the Seven to serve "the least" of Jesus' mothers and sisters
 - Full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom (reflecting Jesus, the shoot from Jesse's stump and Servant of the Lord, Isaiah 11:1–5)
 - Charged to feed hungry widows

VI. Word Growth, Supported by Compassionate Deeds, Fosters Church Growth (6:7)

- A. The growing word (see Acts 12:24; 19:20)
- B. "A great many priests" (see Acts 4:34; Deuteronomy 14:28–15:4)

Session 4 Shepherding Wayward Sheep

Ezekiel 34:1-24

Dr. Dennis Johnson, Westminster Seminary California

- I. God's Vulnerable Flock in 21st-Century America: Wayward Sheep, Negligent Shepherds
 - A. Wayward Sheep: Wandering, Wounded, Weak, Warring
 - B. Negligent Shepherds: busy, timid, risk-averse, indifferent, arrogant

II. Preventative Care

- A. Welcome to the flock—spell out "up front" the mutual commitments of sheep and shepherds
- B. Belabor the *privilege* of accountability, for shepherds and for sheep
- C. Know sheep by name, by heart. Different sheep need (Ezekiel 34:2–4, 11–18): (1) Feeding [all]
 - (2) Strengthening [weak]
 - (3) Bandaging [wounded]
 - (4) Seeking and gathering [wandering]
 - (5) Strong rebuke (34:17–22) [warring bullies]
- D. Nip infectious diseases in the bud (consistent, costly biblical peacemaking)
 - (1) Within particular sheep (Galatians 6:1–4)
 - (2) Between sheep and sheep (Philippians 4:1–3)

(3) Among the flock at large (Hebrews 12:12–17)

III. **Proactive Retrieval**

- A. Pray
 - (1) For the prior convicting work of God's Spirit in the wayward sheep's
 - (2) For humble boldness, mindful of your own spiritual vulnerability (Galatians 6:1)
 - (3) For wisdom and words that fit the sheep's need
- B. The Peacemakers' "Four G's"
 - (1) Glorify God (1 Corinthians 10:31) focus on your own motives
 - (2) Get the log out of your eye (Matthew 7:5) focus on your own actions, reactions, inaction. Ask yourself: Does step (3) below need to precede step (4)?
 - (3) [Go and] Gently restore (Matthew 18:15–20; Galatians 6:1; 2 Timothy 2:23– 26)
 - (4) Go and be reconciled (Matthew 5:23–24)
- C. Keep the circle small (Matthew 18:15–16), but engage an abundance of counselors (Proverbs 11:14; 24:6).
- D. Welcome the repentant home (2 Corinthians 2:5–11)
 - (1) Expect "the fruit of repentance." (Luke 3:8–14; Ephesians 4:28)
 - (2) But do not impose "penance" (self-denial for the sake of becoming more "worthy" of grace, forgiveness, and acceptance)
 - (3) Implement a proactive process for ongoing restoration, sustained by supportive relationship (Barnabas with John Mark, perhaps? Acts 13:13; 15:36–39; Colossians 4:10; 2 Timothy 4:11)
