"The Power of Humility" Philippians 2:3-8 Aug. 14, 2011

To be humble like Jesus,
the Christ-follower is

1. Not selfish.

"Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit..." (3a)

2. In <u>submission</u> to the needs of others.

"but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others." (3b-4)

3. Able to see true value and identity.

"Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men." (5-7)

4. <u>Surrendered</u> to God's plan no matter the cost.

"Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." (8)

Application:

- 1. Are you humble, with the humility of Christ? In what specific ways can you show humility this week?
- 2. Make a list of all the descriptive words and phrases concerning your identity in Christ. Thank Him for your true identity.

Bible Study Questions/ Discussion "The Power of Humility" Philippians 2:3-8 Aug. 14, 2011

- 1. Discuss some of the misunderstandings you have observed in your life concerning "humility." If we are to follow Christ we must properly understand "humility." Humility begins with a negative command found in Phil. 2:3a. What must stop? Discuss the connection of pride with selfishness. Read James 3:14-16 and share times when selfishness hurt a church or a family.
- 2. What does it mean to have "empty conceit?" (Phil. 2:3) Read the following passages and share a time when you were proud of some accomplishment but as time went on it was empty. (Rom. 11:25; Gal. 6:3; 5:26)
- 3. In Phil. 2:3b there is a positive command for us to follow if we want to be "humble." Review some of the descriptions of humility and identify some benefits or ideas of humility.

- 4. How did Paul see himself in comparison to others? (I Cor. 15:9; Eph. 3:8; I Tim. 1:15) How can we do a better job "looking out for the interests of others?" (Rom. 12:15; 14:19; Gal. 6:2)
- 5. A Humble Christ follower understands their true identity. What was the true identity of Christ? (Phil. 2:5-6) (Also 2 Cor. 4:4; Col. 1:15; John 17:5) When Jesus "emptied Himself," what does that mean? (John 17:5; 5:20; Matt. 24:36; 2 Cor. 8:9; Matt. 27:46)
- 6. Jesus was willing to take the form of a bond servant. What was He seeking to accomplish? (John 1:14; Heb. 2:14; 4:15) Even though He was "100% God" He was "100% man." When people saw Him did they see a supernatural presence or a mere man? (John 10:33; Isa. 53:2)
- 7. Discuss the submission of Jesus to His Father. (Matt. 26:39; Heb. 12:2) Imagine the experience of dying by crucifixion. Imagine this happening to the Creator of the universe. Why did He humble Himself in such a way? (Rom. 5:8) As followers of Christ, are you willing to be humble as Christ was humble? What needs to change? What can you do today that takes the role of servant?
