- I. Master "It came to pass...that the Lord met him" (vs. 24-26)

 Don't undervalue His:
 - A. Presence "the Lord met him"
 - **B.** Precepts "and sought to hill him"
 - C. Persistence "So, He let him go"
- II. Method "the Lord said go Aaron, Go" (vs. 27-30)

Don't undervalue a need to:

- **A.** Connect "And he went, and met him...kissed him"
- **B.** Convene "And Moses and Aaron went and gathered"
- C. Communicate "all the words...the Lord had spoken"
- III. Mission "the Lord had...looked upon their affliction" (v. 31)


 Don't undervalue their need to:
 - A. Perceive "when they heard"
 - **B.** Possess "And the people believed"
 - C. Prize "they bowed their heads and worshipped"
