1. A stick that turned into a snake.
2. The affliction and removal of Leprosy upon himself.
3. Turning water into blood.

1. John the Baptist was the prophesied herald that God raised up to announce the Messiah, and he did so in John 1:29-34. However, after John the Baptist was arrested, John appears to have some doubts as to the identity of Jesus.
  - a. What did Jesus say to clarify that He (Jesus) was exactly who John had announced Him to be? See Luke 7:18-23.

2. As Jesus began his ministry, a man named Nicodemus took notice. See John 3:1-2.
  - a. What had Nicodemus rightly deduced from the miracles that were performed by Jesus? \_\_\_\_\_
  - b. Side note: Where is Nicodemus mentioned again in the book of John?

3. In the four gospels, signs, miracles, and wonders are primarily attributed to Jesus. See John 21:25.
  - a. However, upon Jesus death and ascension back to heaven, who are the primary ones who are performing signs, miracles, and wonders? See Acts 2:42-43, Romans 15:18-19, 2 Corinthians 12:12. \_\_\_\_\_

4. Even though signs, miracles, and wonders were an obvious supernatural stamp of approval on the gospel that the Apostles preached, as with Jesus, it did not always result in belief. See Acts 14:1-7 for one example and Acts 8-19 for another. What did some of the witnesses of the miracles want to do, and did do to Paul? \_\_\_\_\_.
5. Miracles have meaning. Read John 21:1-7 regarding a miracle that Jesus performed after his resurrection from the dead.
  - a. What was the purpose of the supernatural sign? \_\_\_\_\_
