## THE SCRIPTURES TESTIFY OF CHRIST John 5: 39-40

**In this** context of scripture Christ is speaking about the things that õtestifiedö (things that õbore witnessö) of Him while He walked on the earth. **John**, the Baptist, õbore witnessö of Him.

Look at John 5: 31-33 "If I bear witness of myself, my witness is not true.

- 32 There is another that beareth witness of me; and I know that the witness which he witnesseth of me is true.
- 33 Ye sent unto John, and he bare witness unto the truth."

All of Christøs õworksö, His miracles, as well as, the õworksö that ended at the Cross õbore witnessö of Him.

Look at John 5: 36 "But I have greater witness than that of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me."

**His** Father obore witnesso of Him.

Look at John 5: 37 "And the Father himself, which hath sent me, hath borne witness of me." (At His baptism and at His Transfiguration)

**But**, long BEFORE His Incarnation, Christ had His witnesses. **He** had all the Old Testament SCRIPTURES. **In our** context He mentioned the õwritingsö of Moses.

Look at John 5: 45-47 "Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is one that accuseth you, even Moses, in whom ye trust.

- 46 For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me.
- 47 But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?"

**Then**, after His resurrection, His disciples were doubtful and wondering and confused about what was happening. **And**, Christ used the SCRIPTURES (O.T.) to open their understanding.

Look at Luke 24: 44-45 "And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.

45 Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures,"

Christ did not point His disciples back to His virgin birth or His miracles; nor, (even) back to the Cross. He pointed them to the SCRIPTURES. The SCRIPTURES testify of Christ. If ANY would learn of Christ the SCRIPTURES are where they MUST look.

Now, look at John 5: 39-40. This is where we will focus our attention for the rest of this message. "Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me. 40 And ye will not come to me, that ye might have life." Explain!

**Today**, we will consider just one thing from this context. We will consider WHO it is, (WHO is this), that sinners WILL NOT come to?

**WHO** will sinners NOT come to? **They** will NOT come to the Christ TESTIFIED OF in the scriptures.

The SCRIPTURES õtestifyö of Christ. They õbear witnessö of Him. This is the language of a courtroom. The prosecuting and the defense attorneys call õwitnessesö. These õwitnessesö TESTIFY either for or against the one on trial.

The SCRIPTURES õtestifyö of Christ. The õtestimonyö they give IDENTIFIES Him. The õwitnessö they õbearö of Him DISTINGUISHES Him from the õmany antichristsö John spoke of (I John 2:18).

The scriptures IDENTIFY and DISTINGUISH Christ in such a (thorough) way that those who go by the SCRIPTURES (i.e. those who judge by the SCRIPTURES) will not be deceived. Like a õwitnessö in a courtroom is sworn to do, the SCRIPTURES (always) tell the truth.

And, WHAT do the scriptures õtestifyö of Christ. What õwitnessö do they õbearö of Him? They õtestifyö several things. They FIRST õtestifyö WHO He is. They õbear witnessö that He is God and Man in one Person. How important is the constitution of Christos Person? It is VITAL.

**Jesus** Christ is a UNIQUE Person. **There** is no other like Him. **He is** the ONLY Person with two DISTINCT natures. **He is** both God and man in one Person. **He is** not PART man and PART God; but FULLY man and FULLY God.

**His** two natures are not comingled. **They** are separate. **In Him** infinite deity and true (sinless) humanity exist in perfect harmony. **Look** at some scriptures which declare Christ to be God and man in One Person.

Look at Romans 1: 1-4 "Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

- 2 (Which he had promised afore by his prophets in the holy scriptures,)
- 3 Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was <u>made of the seed</u> of David according to the <u>flesh</u>;
- 4 And <u>declared to be the Son of God</u> with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:"

Christ was õ<u>made</u> of the seed of Davidö. That speaks of His humanity. But, He was DELCARED (not made), to be the Son of God. He was always the (eternal) Son of God. That speaks of His deity.

Look at another SCRIPTURE that õwitnessesö Christ to be God and man. Look at Isaiah 9: 6 "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace."

õA child is born.ö A virgin did conceive and bear a child. But, a Son was (not conceived but) GIVEN. He was formed in the womb of Mary by the Holy Spirit without the aid of man. Christ was prophesied in Genesis 3: 15 to be the õwoman¢s seedö. He was not (physically) connected to (not a son of) Adam.

Look at John 1: 1-2 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

2 The same was in the beginning with God."

And, John 1: 14 "And the Word was <u>made flesh</u>, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."

Christ is the eternal Word, coequal with God, the Father, and God, the Holy Spirit. He was õin the beginningö. I.e. He is eternal. He was õmade fleshö. The eternal Word took into union with His deity true (sinless) humanity (body and soul).

One more scripture, look at Galatians 4: 4 "But when the fulness of the time was come, <u>God sent forth his Son</u>, <u>made of a woman</u>, made under the law,"

God (the Father) õsent forth His Sonö. That's His deity. The Son was õmade of a womanö. That's His humanity.

**The** Christ of the Scriptures is One like no other. **He is** truly God (infinite Deity). **He is** true (sinless) humanity (body and soul). He is God and man in one (glorious) Person.

It is VITAL that Christ be both God and man. There had to be a sacrifice, a death, an offering. There had to be the shedding of blood (without which there is no remission of sins). God (absolutely considered) is spirit. He has no blood to shed. He is infinite. He cannot die. The shedding of blood and death are to be attributed to Christøs humanity though they are true of His whole Person.

On the other hand, the sin Christ bore by imputation was against an infinite God and required an infinite payment (infinite punishment; eternal death). It was Christøs deity that gave that infinite value to His sacrifice and death. One who was MERELY God or MERELY man could not have put away sin or brought in everlasting righteousness. That work required One who is God and man.

One more thing before we leave this subject. It is NECESSARY for those who come to Christ and rest their eternal salvation in Him to understand that the Person they are coming to and resting in is both God and man. No other Person could have satisfied the law and justice of God. No other Person could have put away sin. No other Person could have established an everlasting righteous of infinite value. No other Person could have glorified God in the full, free salvation of ungodly sinners.

**To** worship and trust a õsaviorö who is not God and man in One Person is idolatry. **It is** to worship and trust õanother Jesusö. **It is** to worship and trust õyou know not whatö. **No** sinner has worshipped the Savior õtestified ofö in the SCRIPTURES until they worship the One who is God and man.

**The** FIRST way the Scriptures IDENTIFY and DISTINGUISH Christ: **They** õbear witnessö of His Person (WHO He is). **They** declare Him to be God and man.

The SCRIPTURES õtestifyö of Christ. They õtestifyö of His Person. They õtestifyö WHO He is. The second thing the SCRIPTURES õtestifyö is WHAT Christ HAS DONE. He HAS DONE a work. He has õFINISHED the work His Father gave Him to doö. What is that õworkö?

In the Old Testament we can see that õworkö prophesied. Look at Daniel 9: 24 "Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to <u>finish the transgression</u>, and to make an end <u>of sins</u>, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy."

The New Testament declares the õworkö FINISHED. Look at Hebrews 9: 26 "For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath <u>he</u> appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself."

Christ bore the sins of His people in His body on the tree. His death õput awayö EVERY sin He bore. He suffered the FULL punishment Godøs Justice demanded for that sin. Those sins are õput awayö so completely that they will never be brought up again in the court of Godøs Justice. East from West.

These sins CANNOT be charged to the sinners who committed them. And, Godøs wrath can NEVER fall on those sinners because their sins were charged to Christ. And, He drank the cup of Godøs wrath in FULL. These sinners CANNOT perish. Their sins are õput awayö. To think that ANY sinner Christ died for could perish is a CONTRADICTION of the SCRIPTURES that õtestify ofö Him. How could a sinner perish whose sins were õput awayö by the death of Christ? Christ's death õput awayö the sin of EVERY sinner He died for.

Also, look at Romans 4: 23-25 "Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him; 24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead;

25 Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification."

Christ was õdeliveredö up to the Cross because the sins (õoffencesö) of those He represented were imputed to Him. He was õraised from the deadö because by His obedience unto death, He had õput awayö those sins and established the (One) Righteousness by which God declares every sinner in Him FOREVER Righteous. He was õraised againö because He had established (in time) the Righteousness by which God had justified His people from eternity.

This õworkö is DONE. It is not BEING done. It is FINISHED. In John 17 (in anticipation of the Cross), Christ said, õI have FINISHED the work which thou gavest me to doö. In John 19: 30 His last words from the Cross were, õIt is FINISHEDö. And, the Father declared Christøs work FINISHED when He raised Him from the dead.

The scriptures õtestifyö of Christ. They õtestifyö that He is the God-man. They õtestifyö that He has õput awayö the sin of and established Righteousness for every sinner He was given. Those sinners are justified by His Righteousness imputed. That õworkö is (already) DONE. Now, thirdly, the SCRIPTURES õtestifyö WHO Christ did this õworkö FOR.

**Christ** was not acting as a private person. **I.e. He** was not acting on His own behalf. **He did** not do what He did for Himself. **He** came as a Representative. **He** came as the Surety of those His Father had õgiven Himö.

Look at John 17: 1-2 "These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:

## 2 As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to <u>as many as thou hast given him.</u>"

**In a** Covenant made before time (called the Everlasting Covenant of Grace), The Father chose a people and õgaveö them to His Son. **What** does it mean, He õgaveö them? **It** means He õentrustedö them to the Son.

**Now**, we know something about õentrustingö (\$\$\$ to banks; children to daycare; children to educators. **The word** õgaveö has the same meaning here.

**The** Father chose a multitude of sinners unto salvation. **He** õentrustedö the COMPLETE salvation of THOSE He chose to the Son. **He** appointed the Son the Surety of THOSE sinners. **He** made the Son responsible to do EVERYTHING necessary (meet EVERY condition, fulfill EVERY requirement) to bring THESE sinners to Final Glory.

What Christ did in His obedience unto death, He did for THOSE sinners He was õgivenö. The õworkö He õfinishedö was (exclusively) for THEM. The salvation He ACCOMPLISHED by His obedience unto death was THEIR salvation. He õput THEIR sin awayö. And, the Righteousness He established by His obedience unto death is the Righteousness by which the Father declares THEM Righteous in His sight. THESE sinners are holy, unblameable, and unreproveable in Godøs because of Christøs Righteousness imputed ALONE.

**These** are those who were ochosen in Christ before the foundation of the worldo.

Look at Ephesians 1: 3-4 "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:

4 According as he <u>hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world</u>, that we should be holy and without blame before him."

**These** are those sinners who will NOT BE left among those who WILL NOT come to Christ. **These** start out among those who will not come. **But,** Christ will deliver them from that way. **That** brings us the last thing we will look at today concerning what the SCRIPTURES õtestifyö of Christ.

**The** scriptures õtestifyö of Christ. **They** õtestifyö that He is the God-man. **They** õtestifyö that He has ACCOMPLISHED the salvation of every sinner He was given. **They** õtestifyö of the õworkö He has ALREADY done. **They** õtestifyö WHO He did this õworkö for.

**And,** last of all, the scriptures õtestifyö WHAT Christ is doing NOW. **They** õtestifyö what He is doing in these õlast daysö (the time between His lst & His 2<sup>nd</sup> coming). **Thankfully**, all will not end up among those who õwill not come to Christö. **By** Godøs mercy and grace, those chosen in Christ, those redeemed by His blood, will be delivered.

**Christ** is the õgood Shepherdö and has õlaid down His life for His sheepö. **He has** redeemed them by His blood. **But,** these sheep are scattered all over the world in every generation. **They** are wandering in the wilderness of false religion. **They** are scattered among those õwho will not come to Christö.

They dongt know who their Shepherd is. **But,** they will. **They MUST.** As their Shepherd, Christ is seeking them out and bringing them into the fold. "He ever liveth to make intercession for them.ö (Heb 7:25).

Look at John 10: 16 "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd."

**He** MUST bring them. **He** MUST (He will) bring them into the fold. **Every** sheep will know their Shepherd. Every redeemed sinner will know their Redeemer.

Look at John 10: 14 "I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine."

**Christ** (already) knows His sheep. **And,** by the end of this age each of His sheep will know Him. **They** will know that He is their Shepherd. **Each** of His sheep will (in each generation) ocome to Himo.

Look at John 6: 37-40 "All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.

- 38 For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.
- 39 And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.
- 40 And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day."

**The** glory of the Father and the glory of the Son depend upon ALL the sheep coming to their Shepherd. **They** MUST come. **And,** they WILL come. **He** WILL õraiseö them ALL up õat the last dayö.

And, they will follow Him.

Look at John 10: 27-30 "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

- 28 And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand.
- 29 My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. 30 I and my Father are one.

The sheep will rest their complete salvation in Him. They will each know that God declares them righteous because of Christøs righteousness imputed to them.

**This** age is all about Christ bringing His sheep to their Shepherd. He MUST bring them. **And He** WILL bring them. **And,** how does He bring them? **He** teaches them.

Look at John 6: 45 "It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. <u>Every man</u> therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me."

**He** brings each of them the same way He brought His disciples after His resurrection. **He** teaches them the SCRIPTURES that õtestifyö of Him.

**He** brings each of His sheep to their Shepherd by opening their understanding to the SCRIPTURES that õbear witnessö of Him. **He** sends them a Gospel preacher and then sends the Holy Spirit to convince them of their NEED of the Savior and the salvation declared in that message.

**Coming** to Christ is (without a doubt) the single most important step any sinner will take in this life. **It is** (without a doubt) the most important decision any sinner will make. **Failing** to come to Christ, then, must be the worst.

We have looked at the Christ õtestified ofö in the SCRIPTURES. We have seen WHO He is (God and man in One Person). We have seen WHAT He has (already) done.

He has (already) put away the sin and established the Righteousness by which God declares EVERY sinner He died for (eternally) Righteous in His sight.

We have seen WHO He did this work for (those ochosen in Him before the world begano; **those** whose (complete) salvation the Father entrusted to Him). And, we have seen WHAT He is doing now. He is calling His sheep to their Shepherd.

The õtestimonyö of the Scriptures concerning the Person of Christ (WHO He is and WHAT He has done) is so precise, so particular that anyone believing the SCRIPTURES cannot fail to see that THIS Christ is NOT the õsaviorö we have in our minds by nature.

**So,** the question is NOT will you come to Christ? **Every** õchristianö religion urges sinners to come to õChristö. **The** question is will you come to THE Christ õtestified ofö in the SCRIPTURES? **Will** you come to the Christ the Gospel has declared to you? **Will** you turn from (repent of) the õChristö you THOUGHT you had before you heard the Gospel that õbears witnessö of HIM.

THE SCRIPTURES TESTIFY OF CHIRST. WHO will sinners NOT ocome too? They will NOT come to the Christ TESTIFIED of in the scriptures.

At the final judgment, there will be present two categories of sinners. These categories have different names in the Bible. They are called sheep and goats; saved and lost; those who have õdone goodö and those who have õdone evilö. And, in today¢s lesson: those who come to THE Christ the SCRIPTURES õtestify ofö and those who will NOT (Those who refuse to) come to HIM.

I will close by encouraging you as Moses did those of his day.

Look at Deuteronomy 30: 19 "I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live:"

Choose life. Choose Christ. Choose to come to THE Christ õtestified ofö in the SCRIPTURES.
