Eph. 1:3 Blessed be the God and <u>Father</u> of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, **4** even as <u>he chose us</u> in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love **5** he <u>predestined us for adoption</u> to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, **6** to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. **7** In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, **8** which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight **9** making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ **10** as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. **11** In him we have <u>obtained an inheritance</u>, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, **12** so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. **13** In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, <u>were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit</u>, **14** who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

Rom. 8:14 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

Gal. 3:26 for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.

Matt. 6:9 Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

Matt. 3:17 and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

1John 3:10 By this it is evident who are <u>the children of God</u>, and who are <u>the children of the devil</u>: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not love his brother.

Jesus, the Firstborn Son

Col. 1:15 He is the image of the invisible God, the <u>firstborn</u> of all creation.

Rom. 8:29 For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be <u>conformed to the image of his</u> <u>Son</u>, in order that he might be the <u>firstborn</u> among many brothers.

Dr. Stephen Wellum wrote:

...Connecting the imaging function of Christ to his role in creation by Paul's reference to Christ as "the firstborn of all creation"...in terms of *rank* and *authority*. Paul's use of *firstborn* comes out of the Old Testament. Israel's identity as God's "firstborn" son (Ex. 4:22) entailed the nation's status as representative and ruler for God in the world. And the Davidic king also received the title: "I will make him the firstborn, the highest of the kings of the earth" (Ps. 89:27). *Firstborn*, then has the connotation of supreme over, which is precisely its meaning in Colossians 1:15.

2c) The Privileges of Sonship

<u>1 – Privilege of Receiving God's Fatherly Love</u>

John 1:11 He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. **12** But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, <u>he gave the right to become children of God</u>, **13** who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, <u>but of God</u>.

Eph. 1:4 even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love **5** he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will,

1John 3:1 See what kind of <u>love the Father</u> has given to us, that we should be called <u>children of God</u>; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

2 – The Privilege of Having Access to our Loving Father

Rom. 8:15 For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the <u>Spirit of adoption as sons</u>, by whom we cry, "<u>Abba! Father</u>!" **16** The <u>Spirit himself bears witness with</u> <u>our spirit that we are children of God</u>, **17** and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

<u>3 – The Privilege of Receiving our Father's Loving Care</u>

Rom. 8:31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, <u>who can be against us?</u> **32** He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, <u>how will he not also with him graciously give us all things</u>? **33** Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. **34** Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. **35** Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? **36** As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." **37** No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. **38** For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, **39** nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, <u>will be able to separate us from</u> the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

4 – The Privilege of Receiving our Father's Loving Discipline

Heb. 12:3 Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. **4** In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. **5** <u>And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons</u>? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. **6** <u>For the Lord</u> <u>disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."</u>

Heb 12:7 It is for <u>discipline</u> that you have to endure. <u>God is treating you as sons.</u> For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? **8** If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. **9** Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? **10** For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but <u>he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness</u>. **11** For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, <u>but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness</u> to those who have been <u>trained</u> by it.

JI Packer wrote about Adoption: "...the entire Christian life has to be understood in terms of it. Sonship must be the controlling thought – the normative category, if you like - at every point." (JI Packer, Knowing God, p209)
