A. Ableism

You shall not curse the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind, but you shall fear your God: I am the Lord. (Leviticus 19:14)

Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me. (Matthew 25:40)

B. Ageism

"You shall stand up before the gray head and honor the face of an old man, and you shall fear your God: I am the Lord." (Lev 19:32)

Do not rebuke an older man but encourage him as you would a father, younger men as brothers, older women as mothers, younger women as sisters, in all purity. (1 Tim 5:1-2)

III. The Bible's Teaching on How We Should Treat One Another

A. Extreme 1: Partiality - avoid it!

So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality (Acts 10:34)

My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. (James 2:1)

B. Extreme 2: Indiscretion - avoid it!

"Do not judge by appearances, but judge with right judgment." (John 7:24)
Have I then become your enemy by telling you the truth? (Galatians 4:16)
speaking the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15)

C. Command: Treat fellow human beings as image-bearers of God the Creator.

And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:37-4)

- A. What sociologists and psychologists say

Christians in the Roman Empire, Jewish persecution in Europe, Homosexuality in modern culture

- C. Yet, the Bible often offers counter-cultural identities

II. Society's Poor Track Record

- A. Racism

"And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth" (Acts 17:26)

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:28)

"After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands" (Revelation 7:9)

- B. Sexism

"So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." (Genesis 1:27)

- C. Xenophobia

"The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself." (Leviticus 19:34)
