Acts 2:46; Matt. 5:21-24; Exodus 20:1-13

As we come to the Lord’s Table, the sixth commandment brings a pointed message: do not murder humans with your hand or hate your brother in your heart. Human beings are God’s image-bearers (though corrupted), therefore human life is sacred and must never be taken unlawfully (remember Gen 9:6 & Ro. 13:4). But Christ digs deeper in Matthew 5:22 applying the commandment to a time when “your brother has something against you.” Uproot your anger and bitterness! Pursue reconciliation through forgiveness so that you might “receive your food with glad and generous hearts” today!
