HC 112 Q. What is God's will for you in the Ninth Commandment? A. God's will is that I never give false testimony against anyone, twist no one's words, not gossip or slander, nor join in condemning anyone without a hearing or without a just cause. Rather, in court and everywhere else, I should avoid lying and deceit of every kind; these are devices the devil himself uses, and they would call down on me God's intense anger. I should love the truth, speak it candidly, and openly acknowledge it. And I should do what I can to guard and advance my neighbor's good name.

**Kevin DeYoung** "We can gossip in one of two ways: by passing a rumor that can't be substantiated or by passing along a true report unnecessarily."

**Kevin DeYoung** "Gossip can be deceit even if it is true because it leads people to think worse of others than they should."

**Philip Ryken** "Sometimes what a gossip reports is true, but it is said to the wrong person or for the wrong reason, to the injury of others. The words may contain some version of the truth, but the testimony is false because it is malicious."

**Proverbs 18:13**  $^{13}$  He who answers a matter before he hears it, It is folly and shame to him. (NKJV)

**Genesis 3:1-4** ¹Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, `You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?" ² And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; ³ "but of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God has said, `You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die." ⁴ Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. (NKJV)

**Matthew 5:33-37** <sup>33</sup> "Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform your oaths to the Lord.' <sup>34</sup> "But I say to you, do not swear at all: neither by heaven, for it is God's throne; <sup>35</sup> "nor by the earth, for it is His footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. <sup>36</sup> "Nor shall you swear by your head, because you cannot make one hair white or black. <sup>37</sup> "But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one. If our words fail these simple tests, then it would be better for us not to speak at all."*
