A Picture of a loving Pastor

II Corinthians 1:14 As also ye have acknowledged us in part, that we are your rejoicing, even as ye also are ours in the day of the Lord Jesus. 15 And in this **confidence** I was minded to come unto you before, that ye might have a second **benefit;** 16 And to pass by you into Macedonia, and to come again out of Macedonia unto you, and of you to be brought on my way toward Judaea. 17 When I therefore was thus minded, did I use lightness? or the things that I purpose, do I purpose according to the flesh, that with me there should be yea yea, and nay nay? 18 But as God is true, our word toward you was not yea and nay. 19 For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us, even by me and Silvanus and Timotheus, was not yea and nay, but in him was yea. 20 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us. 21 Now he which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God; 22 Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.

23 Moreover I call God for a record upon my soul, that to spare you I came not as yet unto Corinth. 24 Not for that we

have dominion over your faith, but are helpers of your joy: for by faith ye stand.

2:1 But I determined this with myself, that I would not come again to you in heaviness. 2 For if I make you sorry, who is he then that maketh me glad, but the same which is made sorry by me? 3 And I wrote this same unto you, lest, when I came, I should have sorrow from them of whom I ought to rejoice; having confidence in you all, that my joy is *the joy* of you all. 4 For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote unto you with many tears; not that ye should be grieved, but that ye might know the love which I have more abundantly unto you.

5 But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me, but in part: that I may not overcharge you all.

- Confident of a sweet relationship 1:14 As also ye have acknowledged us in part, that we are your rejoicing, even as ye also are ours in the day of the Lord Jesus. 15 And in this confidence I was minded to come unto you before, that ye might have a second benefit;
 - a. Paul believes that the church still loves him and is loyal to him even if there have been some that have attacked him A Picture of a loving Pastor, II Corinthians, August 26, 2012, Vision Baptist Church 2 of 9

- b. Paul knows that he loves them
- c. The reason he wanted to go by and see them was this special love between them. He liked being with them
- d. Paul wanted to come by and preach to them again and be a blessing to them
- e. This second benefit was a description of his ministry to them
 - i. The word benefit here speaks of causing joy, pleasure, gratification, acceptance
 - ii. It is a favor done without expecting anything in return
 - iii. It was Paul wanting to teach them more wonderful truths about what had happened to them in salvation
 - iv. Paul wanting to tell them about the greatness of their salvation
 - v. A preaching ministry ought to be marked by a graceful sweetness
- Paul wanted to come for a second benefit not to rip their f. faces, skin their hides, call them out but to bless them
- 2. Seeking to be transparent and honest with God's people 17 When I therefore was thus minded, did I use lightness? or the things that I purpose, do I **purpose according to**

the flesh, that with me there should be yea yea, and nay nay? **18** But *as* God *is* true, our word toward you was not yea and nay. **19** For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us, *even* by me and Silvanus and Timotheus, was not yea and nay, but in him was yea. **20** For all the promises of God in him *are* yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us.

- Paul wants God's people to know that he doesn't make decisions about them or the ministry lightly
- b. He doesn't make decisions in the flesh based on what is good for him
- Paul means yes when he says yes even if sometime things don't work out
- d. What he preached about Jesus was definitely true
- e. When Paul may not be all you think that he should be you can still and always trust Jesus
- 3. His attitude towards the people of God 23 Moreover I call God for a record upon my soul, that to spare you I came not as yet unto Corinth. 24 Not for that we have dominion over your faith, but are helpers of your joy: for by faith ye stand.

- The reason Paul didn't make it to Corinth was that he didn't want to go there if he had to come fussing and fighting
- b. Notice that Paul realized that he did not have dominion over their faith
 - i. He was not to Lord it over them
 - ii. He was not above them or greater than them
 - iii. God deliver us from pastors who thing that they have a right to harshly rule over God's people
- c. Paul considered himself to be helpers of their joy
 - It was Paul's goal to help them live in and enjoy their wonderful gift of salvation
 - ii. Paul was looking to help them enjoy the benefits of salvation
 - iii. Paul thrilled to see God's people enjoying what God had done for them
- d. They were to stand fast in their faith.
- e. Paul doesn't determine the depth of their faith or spiritual life
- Deeply loving God's people 2:1 But I determined this with myself, that I would not come again to you in heaviness. 2

- Paul was uncomfortable even visiting while their was still sin among them
- b. He made up his mind that he would rather not come than have to endure a painful visit 2:1 But I determined this with myself, that I would not come again to you in heaviness.
- c. Paul had spoken sternly but it was right and for the best
- d. Paul was looking to be happy and glad by the repentance of those that he had rebuked 2 For if I make you sorry, who is he then that maketh me glad, but the same which is made sorry by me?

- e. Paul is on his way to visit and wants to make sure all has been done to get things right with God in the congregation 3 And I wrote this same unto you, lest, when I came, I should have sorrow from them of whom I ought to rejoice; having confidence in you all, that my joy is *the joy* of you all.
- f. It was never Paul's intention to hurt his brothers and sisters in Christ
- g. When Paul wrote the letter he was crying
- h. He wanted them to know just how much he loved them 4
 For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote
 unto you with many tears; not that ye should be grieved,
 but that ye might know the love which I have more
 abundantly unto you.
- 5. Sin hurts all of us 5 But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me, but in part: that I may not overcharge you all.
 - a. Those that are living in open sin are not just hurting Paul but everyone in the church

- b. Paul doesn't want the church to have to deal with the problems by themselves
- c. He will as a leader face up to his responsibility
- A good pastor will deal with sin. He will not let love cause him to overlook open apparent sin
- e. He will lead the church in disciplining that sin
- 6. Applications that we can take home as a church
 - a. Let's allow God to develop a special love, loyalty, sweetness among us as a church
 - b. As pastor I want to be sure that the messages are of benefit and causing joy and helping you understand who you are in Christ
 - c. Let's not use lightness in our talk of what God wants to do in our church. Let's really seek His will and His glory here
 - d. I ask you to give me the benefit of the doubt when I make mistakes or don't do all that I should but feel free to talk to me.
 - You are welcome to come and tell me what is on your heart, your concerns, I have no dominion over your faith or you

- f. Let's make Vision a place of joy because of what Jesus has done in our lives
- g. The sweet fellowship and family we have should never be a way to cover over sin. Understand when something needs to be addressed and help me help others
- h. Joy can only come in holiness and obedience
