WLC Q. 171. How are they that receive the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper to prepare themselves before they come unto it? A. They that receive the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, are, before they come, to prepare themselves thereunto, by examining themselves 1) of their being in Christ; 2) of their sins and wants; of the truth and measure of their 3) knowledge, 4) faith, 5) repentance, 6) love to God and the brethren, 7) charity to all men, 8) forgiving those that have done them wrong; 9) of their desires after Christ, and 10) of their new obedience; and by renewing the exercise of these graces, by serious meditation, and fervent prayer. **WLC Q. 75.** What is sanctification? A. Sanctification is a work of God's grace, whereby they whom God hath before the foundation of the world chosen to be holy, are in time through the powerful operation of his Spirit, applying the death and resurrection of Christ unto them, renewed in their whole man after the image of God; having the seeds of repentance unto life, and all other saving graces, put into their hearts, and those graces so stirred up, increased, and strengthened, as that they more and more die unto sin and rise unto newness of life

WCF Chapter 4. Of Creation, 1. It pleased God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, for the manifestation of the glory of His eternal power, wisdom, and goodness, in the beginning, to create, or make of nothing, the world, and all things therein whether visible or invisible, in the space of six days; and all very good. 2. After God had made all other creatures, He created man, male and female, with reasonable and immortal souls, endued with knowledge, righteousness, and true holiness, after His own image, having the law of God written in their hearts, and power to fulfill it: and yet under a possibility of transgressing, being left to the liberty of their own will, which was subject unto change. Beside this law written in their hearts, they received a command, not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, which while they kept, they were happy in their communion with God, and had dominion over the creatures.
