- Between Two Worlds by John Stott. Enjoyable treatment. (S, H)
- The Expository Genius of John Calvin by Steve Lawson. A mini-homiletics course in itself. (C)
- (C, H) (C, H) Why Johnny Can't Preach by T. David Gordon. Commends poetry/literature as a help.
- The Imperative of Preaching by John Carrick. Indicative/imperative mood, R-H preaching.
- A Earnest Ministry: The Want of the Times by John Angell James. Preaching must be earnest. (H)
- Lectures to My Students by Charles Spurgeon. Quintessential counsel from a master. **(S)**
- Preaching in the Holy Spirit by Albert N. Martin. Short and potent. A topic usually neglected.* (H)
- (H) The Relevance of Preaching by Pierre Ch. Marcel. Preaching is Christ's speaking through us.
